

Thursday June 25 - 1914

Begins with a calm. Sperm whales raised at day break close to the Schr. Lowered the waist boat at once. Struck the whale and the iron broke, lost the whale. Finished boiling at 11 P.M.
So ends this day Lat $37^{\circ}28' N$
Long $72^{\circ}09' W$

Friday June 26

Very light breeze from WNW
Saw several steamers
Stowed down 44 barrels of oil
Pumps and lights attended to
So ends this day

Lat $38^{\circ}10' N$
Long $73^{\circ}09' W$

Sat June 27 - 1914

Light southerly breeze with fog
Saw Blackfish and Grampine.
and thousands of Porpoises
Caught a Cowfish. Pumps and
lights attended to. So ends this day
Lat $38^{\circ}00' N$
Long $73^{\circ}48' W$

Sunday June 28

Wind from all directions
With thick cloudy weather
Pumps and lights attended to
No Obus

Monday June 29 - 1914

Begins with a heavy thunder storm
and ends with a light SW wind and
a very heavy swell. Vessel cruising
Pumps and lights attended to
So ends this day with all well

Lat $37^{\circ}58' N$
Long $73^{\circ}32' W$

Tuesday June 30 -

Good NW breeze with rough sea
Vessel cruising. Saw Finbacke
Pumps and lights attended to
All well So ends this day Lat $37^{\circ}40' N$
Long $73^{\circ}31' W$

Wed July 1st

Mod NW Breeze Whales were raised
at 4.30 P.M. Lowered in company
with Schr Carlton Bell. P. Powner's
LB & SB each got one. Got the last
whale along side at 10 P.M.
Pumps and lights attended to
So ends this day Lat $37^{\circ}01' N$
Long $73^{\circ}58' W$

Thursday July 2

Begins with Strong NE wind and
rough sea Cut in a 6 barrel
whale and boiled it out before supper
Later part calm with smooth
water Pumps and lights
attended to All well

Lat $37^{\circ}18' N$
Long $73^{\circ}42' W$
