 Whaler Lower three boats. Lowered our boat
 at once. Carlton Bell got one
 SB 1 and our SB got one. Finished
 cutting in at 4 P.M.
 Later part calm Pumps and lights
 attended to So ends this day
 Lat $37^{\circ}15'$
 Long $74^{\circ}01'$

Sat July 4-

Sperm Very light-easterly breeze
 Whaler Three whalers in sight. Slowest down
 28 barrels of oil
 SB 1 Sperm whaler were raised at
 SB 1 6 P.M. Lowered 3 boats at once
 WB 1 each boat caught a whale. Got
 them all on board alongside
 before dark. Vessel looking
 just about the same.
 So ends this day. Lat $37^{\circ}13'$ N
 Long $73^{\circ}49'$ W

Sunday July 5-

Moderate north wind and very
 Cloudy. Spoke Schr W. Graber
 Finished cutting in 3 whales
 at 10 O'clock Started the
 try works at 11 30 a.m.
 Later part Cloudy & thick
 Pumps and lights attended
 to So ends this day
 Lat $37^{\circ}15'$ N
 Long $74^{\circ}28'$ W

Monday July 6. 1914

Begin with moderate gale from NNE
 4 30 P.M. Weather clearing up some as the
 wind beginning to moderate. Finished stowing
 down 50 barrels of Sperm oil. Vessel
 looking quite bad. It takes two hours
 out of every 24 to keep the vessel free
 of water. With one good pump
 So ends this day. Lat $37^{\circ}13'$ N
 Long $74^{\circ}15'$ W

Tuesday July 7th

Begin with very light breeze from
 west N.W. Saw the Schr John R. Manton
 lower for whaler. Lowered our three
 boats at once but did not get fast.
 Later Capt. Santor came on board
 from the Manton and spent the day
 Later part thick and calm
 Lat no obs
 Long " "

Wed July 8

Calm all day with some fog
 Spoke the Schrs W. A. Graber
 and Ellen A. Swift
 Pumps and lights attended to
 (No obs)
