☞ Moderate NE breeze. Sperm whales raised at 9 AM Lowered at once
 LB 1 LB + W Boat each caught one
 WB 1 J Boat struck and the Iron drewed finished cutting in at 4.20 PM
 Pumps and lights attended to
 So ends this day Lat - $37^{\circ}10'$ N
 Long $74^{\circ}02'$ W

Sunday July 26

Very light air from SW Spoke at 5 Mustel Scher and exchanged Longitude. (Both the same)
 Pumps & lights attended to
 So ends this day Lat - $37^{\circ}25'$ N
 Long $73^{\circ}52'$ W

Monday July 27

Sperm Whaler
 LB 1 Clear pleasant weather with very light SE breeze. Stowed down 30 barrels of oil. Sperm whales raised by Mr Gilbert at 4 PM
 LB caught one. No chance for the rest. Pumps and lights attended to. So ends this day
 Lat $37^{\circ}37'$ N
 Long $73^{\circ}41'$ W

Tuesday July 28

Blowing a moderate gale from NE Bar 29.70. Stowed down 20 barrels of oil. Pumps and lights attended to. So ends
 Lat $37^{\circ}24'$ N
 Long $74^{\circ}13'$ W

Wed July 29 - 1914

Blowing a moderate gale from NE
 Vessel Cruising Pumps and lights attended to. All well So ends this day
 Lat $37^{\circ}24'$ N
 Long $74^{\circ}13'$ W

Thursday July 30

NE breeze & squally. Tammed the Scher W.A. Graber. Spoke the Scher Mark E Pemberton. Pumps and lights attended to the Obse

Friday July 31

☞ Begins with a light NE breeze
 Sperm whales sighted on the weather beam at 6.30 AM. Lowered 3 boats at 7.45. J Boat went on and struck and the Iron drewed. W Boat struck about an hour afterwards and the Iron drewed. Boats came on board at noon. From 3 to 5 PM Heavy Thunder storm. Saw 6 Water spouts
 Pumps and lights attended to
 So ends this day Lat - $36^{\circ}45'$ N
 Long $74^{\circ}15'$ W

Sat Aug 1 - 1914

☞ Light SW breeze clear and pleasant
 Sperm whaler at 6.30 AM
 Lowered three boats at 7.30 AM
 LB caught one JB caught two and WB two. finished cutting in at 8 PM Lat - $36^{\circ}30'$ N
 Long $73^{\circ}39'$ W
