 lights attended to all well
 Lat Nil

Tuesday Aug 4
 Very light S.W. air. Finished
 stowing down 60 barrels of oil
 Pumps and lights attended to
 So ended this day Lat - $37^{\circ}29'$
 Long Nil

Wed Aug 5
 Begins and ends with very
 thick foggy weather. Breeze from
 various directions Pumps and
 lights attended to
 So ends this day
 Lat No Obs
 Long

Thursday Aug 6 - 1914
 Begins with plenty of rain
 from NW with heavy rain
 showers Later Strong Gale
 from NE Pumps and
 lights attended to

Lat - $37^{\circ}50'$ N
 Long $73^{\circ}35'$ W

Friday Aug 7 - 1914
 Begins with a calm. Sperm whales
 were raised at 6 AM Lowered 3
 boats at once but could not get
 fast. Boats came on board at
 9 am. At 10 AM light breeze sprang
 up from SW. At 11 AM saw
 another School of whales Lowered
 three boats. 1 Boat struck
 and got a whale. No chance
 for the rest of the boats
 Finished Cutting in at 7 PM
 Pumps and lights attended to
 So ends this day Lat - $37^{\circ}20'$ N
 Long $73^{\circ}33'$ W

Sat Aug 8 +
 Very light S.W. breeze with some fog
 finished boiling at 5:30 PM
 So ends this day
 Lat - $37^{\circ}49'$
 Long $73^{\circ}03'$

Sunday Aug 9
 Begins with light S.B. breeze
 with clear pleasant weather
 Later fair Light breeze from west
 Vessel taking about 6 thousand
 strokes in 24 hours So ends this day
 Lat - $38^{\circ}37'$
 Long $72^{\circ}04'$
