

Bartholomew At St. Carlos 1845
 Monday February 17th 1845 Sail set
 at 10 AM with light breeze from
 the North. Pleasant weather. At 1 PM
 the ship under way the Capt. having
 made out the ship last night. Made
 out with the tide until
 8 PM. Light turned to run in & the
 light being very light. Let go the anchor
 one mile from the Light House
 finished painting ship & got the Beech
 ready for whaling. We have left 2
 whalers (Resorters) behind Frank & Comin

Saturday Feb 18th
 Light breeze from the NW At
 10 PM the tide turned out & we
 took our anchor and stood NW
 by the wind with all sail out at
 1 PM the two extremes points of land
 visible from our ship Bore & S. & by
 compass the nearest land to the East about
 ten miles off. Put the Port anchor in the
 through the night & latter part light breeze
 from the North Ship heading NW by N
 At 10 AM Stowed the anchors and
 chains. Laid in sight to the SE
 Lat 45° 42' 41" 42
 Long 75° 03

Sunday Feb 19th
 First part light breeze from the South
 calm through the night. Latter part
 variable breeze. Let (Dicks) out
 at 10 AM. Saw Hump. Backs & Black
 fish. At noon light breeze from
 the Northward Ship heading NW by N
 got a Lunar Lat 45° 52
 Long 76° 35

Bark *Tanner* from North Pacific 1845
 Monday February 20th
 Commenced with light breeze from the
 North. The wind to the SE. With all
 out, saw Porpoises. At 1 PM the
 more wind came from the North. Crew
 employed with ship's duty

Tuesday Feb 21st
 First Part moderate breeze from NW
 Course NW by N 1/2 S. At 1 PM
 Changed suddenly to the South struck the
 ship aback took in the Light sails & hauled
 reef the fore topsail & reefed the mainsail
 Mid & Latter parts more moderate
 winds variable. Ship heading to SE
 SE, crew variously employed
 Caught a Porpoise Lat 44° 40' North
 Long 77° 30 West

Wednesday Feb 22nd
 Moderate breeze from the NW
 Ship heading SE by S at 4 PM tackled
 to the W at 7 PM Tacked to the SE
 Latter part calm. Wack employed repairing
 an old mainsail Lat 45° 45
 Long 78° 15

Thursday February 23rd
 Calm & Pleasant weather. Finished repairs
 mainsail & sent in & repaired the
 flying jib. Bent it at dark & set
 light breeze from NW Ship heading NW
 Mid & Latter part wind very fresh
 NW to SE tackled ship at daylight
 saw a Prussian ship steering NW
 with all sail out Lat 45° 04 North
 Long 78° 47 West
