Friday March 24th
Moderate breezes & variable from
W to NNE. Steering NE by N. Net
crew making Bone Spun yarn & other work
At 5 P.M. saw a Brig to
the Westward. Supposed it to be the
Monolula. At 8 took in the Stud Sails
Mid & Latter parts light Baffling wind
& Calms. Unkint fore topsail &
fore topgallant sails & Bent
the old ones. Saw the Brig
Monolula of Honolulu to the
NW. Course NE by N
At 10 A.M. Raining
No observation

Saturday March 25th
Commenes with strong breeze from
NNE & rain squalls. Large sea from
NNE. Ship heading NE by N at dark
took up the Boats & Shortened sail
Wind changed to the NNE. Latter part with
squalls & more moderate set standing sails
Tide in fore topgallant inner & hauly ones
Lat 31 46 N
Long 34 14 W

Sunday March 26th
Fresh breeze from the Westward. Course
NNE. At 12 M. lost sight of the Brig
At 4 P.M. set standing sails. Crew employed
with ship's duty. At 4 P.M. Calm
Latter part light breeze from NNE
Ship heading NE. At 10 P.M. took up
to NW
Lat 28 48 N
Long 32 42 W

Monday March 27th
Commenes with moderate breezes from
NNE. Working ship. At 10 A.M. the
wind tacked twice. At day light wind
NNE & Raining through the rain under of
the (law) and (Barge) on from the
at 12 M. took in all sail but main
top sail & fore topmast staysails. Breeze
strong from North
