

Remarks on Board Barque Tamarlane of N.B. 1865
September Tuesday 12th

This day begins with a light breeze from the south ship heading to the westward Mid. L. Last part the same broke out aft & got out the new sails at 10 A.M. saw a breach of the weather beam board the barboard boat but did not see them to game at 1 P.M. came on board one sail in sight fine pleasant weather

Wednesday 13th

This day begins with light ones from the westward ship heading to boat N at 8 P.M. were ship & started with all sail out fine pleasant weather broke out Broom & oil soap & flour & pork nothing more

Thursday 14th

Barboard This day begins with a light breeze from boat the W.S.W. steering & at 8 P.M. saw sperm whale & points of the barboard bow at 3 P.M. whale board the barboard boat & the barboard 70 lb boat struck one & the third mate kill him at 6 P.M. took took him to long side & got ready for cutting though the night but daylight last all hand & commence cutting finish cutting at 3 P.M. & then all hand employed in cutting up the blubber & baling the lard & getting the foreworks ready for boiling nothing in sight fine pleasant weather twenty one days out & we saw 100 whales three times but the one the went faster than the boat could go

Remarks on Board Barque Tamarlane N.B. 1865
September Friday 15th

This day begins with a light breeze from the westward all hands employed in cutting up the blubber & clearing up the decks the ship heading south at daylight started the work soon the clearing & baling the lard & soon to cutting up the blubber fine pleasant weather two sails in sight

Saturday 16th

This day begins with a light breeze from the westward ship heading to the northward the watch employed in trying out sperm oil fine pleasant weather broke out weather

Lat By 55.15 N Long 27.10

Sunday 17th

This day begins with a light breeze from the eastward ship heading to boat north fine pleasant weather the men employed in trying out sperm oil nothing in sight

Lat By 55.16 N Long 27.06

Monday 18th

This day begins with light breeze from the westward ship heading north middle part squally & rainy middle part the wind came out & at 4 P.M. were ship to the southward at 11 P.M. look down the works & heard up the decks Mid. L. Last light was from the S.W. ship heading to boat & the watch employed in fitting the rigging fine pleasant weather nothing in sight
