September Tuesday 19th

This day commences with a light breeze from the eastward ship steering South the watch employed in flogging oil is slowing down oil stowed down 9 last in the four tubs 65 lbs 30 of fine pleasant weather one sail in sight nothing more

No. 11 To Day
Wednesday 20th
First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the eastward steering S by W 11 miles last part strong breeze the watch employed in fitting the rigging

Lat By 11 30 55 N Long 26 54

Thursday 21st
This day commences with a strong breeze from the eastward steering S by W all sail on the ship 11 miles last part the same the watch employed in fitting the rigging fine pleasant weather

No. 12 To Day

Friday 22nd
First part of this day begins with a strong breeze from the eastward ship steering S by W 11 miles last part the same this day at four o'clock stud rail is clear stud rail nothing in sight fine weather the watch employed in ship duty

Lat By 11 35 55 N Long 26 51
Saturday 23rd

This day begins with light breeze from the eastward steering S by W 11 miles last part the same all sail on the ship fine pleasant weather the men employed in ship duty one sail in sight nothing more this day so ends the day

September Sunday 24th

This day begins with a light breeze from the eastward ship steering S by W 11 miles last part the same broke out water fine pleasant weather nothing in sight the watch employed in ship duty

Lat By 11 35 55 N Long 26 15 W
Monday 25th

First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the eastward ship steering S by W 11 miles last part the same broke out bread the men employed in fitting the rigging to the boats nothing in sight fine pleasant weather all sail on the ship so ends this day Lat By 11 19 00 N Long 26 15 W

Tuesday 26th

This day begins with a strong breeze from the eastward ship steering S by W 11 miles last part the same one sail in sight fine pleasant weather the men employed in fitting the rigging spoke the Barque Daniel word left Richmond five months and 18th 11

Lat By 11 16 24 N Long 25 22 E

Wednesday 27th

First part of this day begins with fine pleasant weather ship heading south east at 8 P M 11 miles reef the topails took in the jib main sail at daylight made all sail to go last part strong breeze nothing in sight the ship leaks 300,000 strokes to dry broke and flew the watch employed in ship duty so ends this day
