Remarks on Board Barque Tamerlane N.H.
November Thursday 4th

This day begins with a moderate gale from the north ship heading on distance tacks looking for the sea butales sun rain equal but could not see any of the whales all hands to making sail & taking in sail nothing more only hard luck.

No. 10 to Day
Friday 5th

This day begins with a moderate gale from the north ship under double reef top sails ship heading to the south west at 3 P.M. it began to increase at 4 P.M. took in the four top sail & four sail & set four main spencers & had sea on the ship & laying to broke out flour

Lat by Obs 30.42 S Long 48.34 W
Saturday 6th

First part of this day begins with a moderate gale from the S.W. ship heading south under double reef main top sail & four main spencer & about 5 P.M. it began to moderate & then we began to make sail at 5 P.M. steered S.W. at 6 P.M. saw land three joints of the Labrador bow from this to the beam & then steered S.W. & last part strong breeze kept sail ship on distance tacks Lat by Obs 29.47 S Long

Sunday 7th

This day begins with a light breeze from the S.W. ship heading on distance tacks all sail on the ship. Midle & last part the same nothing in sight fine pleasant weather we land find them dead whales this is what I call hard times

Lat by Obs 30.16 S Long 48.24 W

November Monday 6th

This day begins with a light breeze from the eastward ship under all sail ship on distance tacks though the day at 7 P.M. took in sail down to double reef at 4 P.M. saw a break of the weather & Melanes bear could not tell what it was Lat by Obs 30 S Long 48.21 W

Tuesday 7th

This day begins with a light breeze from the S.W. Midle & last part the same at sun rise made all sail ship on distance tacks though the day the watch employed in ship duty Lat by Obs 30.46 S Long 48.10 W

Wednesday 8th

This day begins with a light breeze from the eastward Midle & last part light air ship on distance tacks though the day at sun set took in sail the men employed in ship duty Lat by Obs 30.52 S Long 48.13 W

Thursday 9th

This day begins with a light breeze from the eastward Midle & last part the same saw humpbacks the watch employed in fitting the rigging at sunset took in sail Lat by Obs 30.15 S Long 47.27 W

Friday 10th

This day commences with a strong breeze from the S.W. ship under double reef top sail & main sail & it steered S.W. though the day at sunset took in sail & kept to the S.W. Lat by Obs 31.30 S Long 48.17 W
