

Remarks on Board Barque Turners Lane N. B. 1865
November Saturday 11th

This day begins with a light breeze from the Eastward Middle & last part the same at daylight made all sail & steared S. S. W. broke out water nothing in sight

Lat by Obs 32.19. S Long 47.56. W
Sunday 12th

First part of this day begins with a light air from the S. W. Middle & last part a strong breeze ship heading S. by E. at daylight made all sail one sail in sight the men employed in ship duty Near weather

Lat by Obs 33.30. S Long 50.00
Monday 13th

This day begins with a light breeze from the Eastward Middle & last part the same ship steared S. W. at 9 P. M. saw a steamer it bore to the S. W. at sunset saw the land it bore S. W. fine pleasant weather at sunset took in sail

Lat by Obs 34.40. S Long 51.26. W
Tuesday 14th

This day begins with a strong breeze from the N. W. at 7 P. M. steared W. & all sail out & ship in sight the men employed in ship duty

Lat by Obs 35.12. S Long 53.04
Wednesday 15th

First part of this day begins with a moderate gale from the N. E. steared N. by E. Middle part strong gale at 8 P. M. took in all sail but fore reef main top sail last part more moderate last part set double top sail jib & main sail last part steared & soon rain N. by E. Day

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November Thursday 16th

This day begins with a moderate gale from the S. W. ship heading S. by E. & laying to under double reef main top sail & four sail & four min spencer to bad weather on one sail in sight this is bad weather

Lat by Obs 36.20. S Long 52.50. W
Friday 17th

This day begins with a gale of wind from the S. W. middle & last part the same ship heading S. by E. with reef main top sail & four sail & four min spencer to bad weather on

N. by E. Day
Saturday 18th

This day begins with a moderate gale from the north laying to middle & last part the same last part clear but to bad weather on at 9 P. M. were ship to the westward ship under double reef top sail

Lat by Obs 37.18. S Long 51.39. W
Sunday 19th

This day begins with a light air all around the compass ship trying to star S. W. fine pleasant weather if the barque union of ragbaker left seeing nothing in sight

Lat by Obs 37.54. S Long 51.15. W
Monday 20th

This day commences with a light breeze from the north Middle & last part strong breeze ship steared S. W. by W. all sail on the ship saw plenty fin backs broke out meat & molasses & fish Near weather the men employed in ship duty

Lat by Obs 38.40. S Long 53.02
