December Friday 8th

This day commences with a light breeze from the Eastward mid' fore light but first strong ship steered N by E then steered from E to north the rest of the day nothing in sight fine pleasant weather the men employed in ship duty.

Saturday 9th

This day commences with a strong breeze from the north first part steered N til 12 A.M. then steered southwest sent down the main sail & fatched it & bent it & gave the same day nothing in sight at 6 P.M. a morate gale at 6 P.M. took in all sail but double reef topails & bad sea on

Sunday 10th

This day begins with a morate gale from the N.E. mid' fore light but first strong last part the wind came out & N.W. ship under double reef main & topails & four sail ship heading to the Eastward & bad swell on fore times

Lat by Obs 40.49. N Long 59.06. W
Monday 11th

This day begins with a morate gale from the N.W. ship heading N by E with double reef topails at 6 A.M. set main sail & ship to boat & at 11 A.M. had to equal took in jib & main sail & four topails at 9 P.M. set them & gave at 11 P.M. took them in to gave blowing heavy & bad sea on shore times nothing in sight the men employed in ship duty.

This day commences with a light breeze from the N.W. ship heading N by E mid' & last part the same fine pleasant weather the men employed in ship duty nothing in sight but Kilos

Wednesday 13th

First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the N.E. ship steering N by E mid' & last part strong breeze from the N.W. ship & beating to the N.W. humpbacks in sight the all the men employed in ship duty

Thursday 14th

First part of this day begins with a strong gale from the N.W. took in all sail but top reef main & topails mid' fore light but first part light breeze ship trying to steer N.W. last part all sail on the ship & bad sea on broke out watters Flour & Flour is bread & filed up the empty bread casks with salt water put in 50 lbs of water clear weather the men employed in ship duty

Friday 15th

This day commences with a light breeze from the N.W. ship steering N.W. fine pleasant weather all sail on the ship nothing in sight the men employed in ship duty
