 Remarks on board barque Tamarlane N. H.
 January Wednesday, 10th

First part of this day begins with a heavy gale Middle & last part fine pleasant weather. The wind from the W first part Fock in all sail but then reef main top sail last part all sail on deck headed S at 8 P M hauled all hands & took out the main hatch & stowed down 98 1/2 lbs of S in the nothing in sight or fog this day

 Thursday, 11th

This day commences with a light breeze from the S W steering S by E fine pleasant weather all hands & working this day Lat by 51.42 N Long 64.59 W

Friday, 12th

This day begins with a light breeze from the W steering S by E all sail out at sun. Took in sail at daylight made all sail & gave the main top sail & four sail split the main royal at 1 P M sent down the main royal yard & fitted it run rain squalls very much in sea

Lat by 51.58 N Long 64.56 W
 Saturday, 13th

This day commences with a light breeze from the S W steering S by E with all sail out & sunset steady at 8 P M saw the main land 2 points of the starboard bow at 9 P M saw starboard land 3 points of the starboard bow 30 miles of middle & last part light & hazy in the ship & beating to windward the east point clear weather of starboard land very much all hands employed in ship duty

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 January Sunday, 14th

This day commences with baffling winds. The wind most of the time S all sail on the ship ship & working to round the east point of starboard land east end of starboard land 15 P M of sun fog one sail in sight very much

 Monday, 15th

This day begins with a strong breeze from the S W all sail on the ship ship heading to land S W Two sail in sight & bad sea on Lat by 56.06 N Long 65.45 W

Tuesday, 16th

First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the S W steering S by W all sail on Middle part the same at 11 P M a squall came out from the south it blew heavy for one hour took in all sail but sun the main top sail & four sail split the main royal at 1 P M sent down the main royal yard & fitted it run rain squalls very much in sea

Lat by 56.14 N Long 66.27 W
 Wednesday, 17th

First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the S W steering S by W with double reef top sails middle part the same to land S W the wind came out from the W very squally run rain & bad sea on at 5 P M reef the top sails & took in the main sail & four sail & set four & main ofencer & fitted up the bow board at 5 P M saw land Cape Horn it bore S W 25 miles of it very bad time in sea

Lat by 57.05 N Long 66.51 W

at 6 P M saw land 14 points of the starboard bow Lat by 54.50 N Long 64.16 W
