January Thursday 18th

Light part of this day begins with a heavy
gale from the westward Middle S last part
light air ship heading to land S by W first part
had close reef topsail last part all sail on
smooth the men employed in ship July
Lat by Obs 57.40.0 Long 67.02.38

Friday 19th
This day commences with a light breeze
from the S by W ship heading W by W with
all sail on at 5 A M Tack ship to the north
at 6 A M saw land 3 points of the starboard
bow 15 miles of it from to be late horn
very fine weather clear smooth one
sail in sight the men employed in ship
July

Lat by Obs 56.40.0 Long 67.17. W
Saturday 20th

This day commences with a calm & boat
9 A M a light breeze spring up from the S by E
middle S last part to land & not breeze turn
rain ship steering S by W with all sail out
at 5 P M raised the rocks tall Diego 3 points
of the starboard bow 25 miles of fine pleasant
weather caught to forenoon

Sunday 21st

This day commences with a strong breeze
from the S ship heading S by W by W trying
to go S part the Diego Diego barer W 12 M of
at 5 P M Tack ship to the north at 12 P M
Tack to go S to the south at 5 P M the wind
began to haul to the westward at 12 P M
the headed S by W by W middle part took in
the light sails last part all sail on sunny rain

January Monday 22nd

This day commences with a heavy gale from
the S by W ship heading S by W most of the time
ship under close reef four main topsail (10
staysails at 11 P M took in the four topsail at
9 A M it to go S to go S by W had sea on three
harbour boat hauled up to the Jans heads
two sails in sight sun rain sun hail
the men employed in ship July

Lat by Obs 57.51.0 Long 70.05.
Tuesday 23rd

This day commences with a heavy gale
from the S by W ship heading to land S by W
under close reef four main topsail (10
all the staysails at 5 P M took in the
four topsail & rain had sea on sun rain
rain clear most of the time

Lat by Obs 58.57.0 Long 71.05
Wednesday 24th

This day commences with a moderate gale
from the S by W ship heading to land S by W
with close reef topsails last part double reef
main sail (10) to sail in sight quite smooth
sun rain sun hail squalls

Lat by Obs 59.10.0 Long 71.17. W
Thursday 25th

This day commences with a light wind
the wind all to round the ship the ship
to try to steer W by W the wind light
a squally sun rain sun hail broke out
broke a weather & had sail on one sail
in sight the men employed in ship
July
