Remarks on Board Barque Casserlane N. B.  
February Friday 16<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with a light breeze from the south ship beating to the north with all sail out at 1 P.M. sail hoisted at 4 P.M. took aboard the harbor & harbor boat & Max & the Jack Barque. Struck the whale & the men broke & the whale went to the N. W. & had fast fast light on at 8 P.M. the last haul and came on board from the barque many & numbers of N.B. the ship & boat 15 miles of the south end of Goffe the next morning we started for Saint Charles the men employed in scraping bones & doing it fine pleasant weather but fast steady N.W. N. No. 10. 11. Day

Saturday 17<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a light breeze from the N.W. ship heading to boat N.W. 1/2 mile fast the wind came out from the north at 8 P.M. were ship to the westward sailing & squally & blowing heavy took in all sail but the reef main & quit & four sail at 7 P.M. the wind came out from the N.W. & it speed & then were ship & steered N.W. by N. made sail to London & the wind the watch employed in ship duty. Lat by 42.31 & Long 74.52

Sunday 18<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a light breeze from the N.W. steering N.E. all sail on at 8 P.M. made the passage with wind & light but the wind so light that we could not get in so laid to back that night had 20 M. of it came N.W. at daylight started to go back fast the wind came out from the N.W. & light got up the chain & got the anchors of the bow the wind so light that we could not get in this day the men employed in ship duty. Lat by 42.42 & Long 74.58

Remarks on Board Barque Casserlane N. B.  
February Monday 19<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a light breeze from the N.W. ship & beating to the north very light on a mile land to boat 15 miles of Saint Charles 15 miles of it bar N.W. 1/2 mile fast light on at 7 P.M. & light breeze springing up from the N.W. the ship steered for the port last fast strong breeze fine weather the men employed in ship duty. No. 10. 11. Day

Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup>

In Port This day commences with a strong breeze on 10 from the N.W. the ship & steering down the coast through the passage at 8 P.M. drift anchor in 2 fathoms & found the sails at 4 P.M. took it to game & went 2 miles further up the bay & then drift the harbor anchor in & to give the ship so to & then got under at daylight all hands & broke out the hole from & aft & got & raft to shore & got it at 8 P.M. & run down to 10 P.M. in the riggers & the last divided for more wood & potatoes & boat 12 lbs of potatoes & went to shore & got 150 lbs of fresh meat the weather sailing & squally

Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup>

In Port This day commences with squally weather in rain at daylight all hands & fill four life 100 lbs of water & then sent to raft to shore & fill it raft & got it at 12 P.M. & then got dinner & basted it in & the rest of the day worked for wood & potatoes & other thing at 2 P.M. the light went to shore for the first time. Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup>

This day commences with fine pleasant weather at daylight all hands & work of & then the harbor watch went to shore on liberty & then the harbor watch watch with the ship and sails all round fine pleasant weather

This is the last day of the voyage of the Casserlane N. B. to Saint Charles & back to the harbor.
