

Remarks on Board Barque Samerlane N. B. 1866
February Friday 25th

In Port This day commences with fine pleasant weather. Laying in for the harbor water went to shore on liberty & the starboard watch painted the bins on the starboard side & broke out the after hole the left side & board all day all hands same of after in the harbor water.

In Port Saturday 26th This day commences with fine pleasant weather at 8 P. M. the starboard watch went to shore on liberty & the left & trailing for wood & potatoes & other thing trailing tobacco & soap & underclothes & other thing.

In Port Sunday 27th This day commences with fine pleasant weather at daylight all hands & wash of the decks & then the starboard watch went to shore on liberty at sunset fetch of 100 fathoms of meet.

In Port Monday 28th This day commences with fine pleasant weather at daylight all hands & wash of the rest of the day the left trailed for potatoes & other things this day they ran away at 5 P. M. the left went to shore & got the look & sent the please men after they pray busy times in deed.

In Port Tuesday 29th This day commences with fine pleasant weather at daylight all hands & wash of the four hole & then wash of & then got breakfast & then the bow road went to shore & got 75 f. of meet & then the need of the day employed in trailing for potatoes & other things busy times & let you all hands had to work.

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February Wednesday 28th

In Port This day commences with fine pleasant weather the left & trailing for potatoes & other things & got one raft of water & got one half of the boat & the left ship two men & fetch them on board.

In Port Thursday 1st This day commences with fine pleasant weather the men employed in ship duty the left & trailing for accounts.

In Port Friday 2nd This day commences with fine weather all hands employed in ship duty the left & trailing for the ship the left hand fetch of half of the bow.

In Port Saturday 3rd This day commences with fine pleasant weather the men employed in ship duty the left & trailing for potatoes & other things.

In Port Sunday 4th This day commences with fine pleasant weather waiting for fair wind to go out but no wind this day so we left to drift sold 10 gallons of sperm oil at 250. per gallon in gold.

In Port Monday 5th First part of this day begins with light air & thick fog but fast & clear but the wind & head so we land yet out & the left went to shore & got 6 half of the bow the men employed in ship duty 4 sail in port.

In Port Tuesday 6th This day commences with thick foggy weather the wind from the north made over the time the men employed in ship duty.
