In Port Remarks on board Barque Tamarlane N.B.
Sunday 18th

This day commences with a rainy northern one watch to show on Libby rain all day

Monday 19th

In Port This day begins with a light breeze from the N at daylight all hands employed in loading 40 bbls of oil & put it on board of the barque Leticia of Gibraltar & the rest of the time to breaking out shels & steaming down water & breaking out meat got one quarter of meat men ruin squales. Lat 9th 45th

Tuesday 20th

In Port This day commences with a light breeze from the N all hands employed in breaking out the after hole for meat & doing other work to land. The ship this day left for N was Wednesday 21st

This day commences with a rainy northern & rain all day heavy all hands to board

Thursday 22nd

In Port This day commences with a thick haze northern the men employed in breaking out bread the last discharge the third made to be 10 tons Friday 23rd

This day commences with a rainy northern all hands to board land is nothing

Saturday 24th

In Port This day commences with a rainy northern all hands to board land yet out

Sunday 25th

This day commences with a north wind land yet out all hands on board

Monday 26th

This day commences with light air from the south four men came of a board and the decks & got ready for sea & hope that we shall go to sea to morrow all hands hard to work

Tuesday 27th

In Port This day commences with a light breeze from the south the left to ship & clearing the ship Wednesday 28th

This day begins with a south wind at 1 P.M. Took the anchor & made all sail & went out got and pass the heads to board of P.M. then steered N.W. by N & then stowed the anchorage & run the chains below & work of two sails went in one to whaler & the other to merchant man & two larks and the same day the sails & the spirit barque two men run to way & the left ship eight 32 men all told on board bound north

Lat by 15 34.39

Thursday 29th

First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the N.W. ship steering N.W. by N with fine weather the wind haul to the north last part strong breeze last part the ship headed to the westward all sail out the men employed in ship only one sail in sight

Lat by 15 34.01.3

Friday 30th

Broad This day commences with a light breeze from south steering N.W. all sail out fine pleasant weather the deeper setting of new shels & the rest employed in fitting the rigging nothing in sight

Lat by 15 32.45 & Long 75.11.34

Saturday 31st

This day commences with a light breeze from the N.W. ship steering N.W. by N fine pleasant weather the men employed in fitting the rigging nothing in sight

Lat by 15 31.44 & Long 75.42.34
