May Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup>

This day commences with a strong breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering W all sail on the ship run to grazing blacks & the left of getting to all hands fine pleasant weather plenty of blackbirds & long rig & but last left for Tern

Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a strong breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering W the men employed in ship duty the left fixin of all boat

Thursday 10<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a light breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering W middle part squally last part still run & fitting the rigging & left hand masts fixin a new boat

L. B. O. 12.34 N Long 150.50 W

Friday 11<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a light breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> middle part last part the same ship steered W by N the men fitting the rigging & fixin a new boat

L. B. O. 13.04 N Long 150.28 W

Saturday 12<sup>th</sup>

This day commences with a strong breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering W middle part squally last part clear the men employed in fitting the rigging & painted the new boat broke out & enclosed

May Sunday 13<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a strong breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering W by S<sup>W</sup> & S<sup>W</sup> nothing in night fine pleasant weather the men employed in ship duty

Sat by Mr. 15 N Long 145.52 W

Monday 14<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a strong breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> middle part squally last part fine ship steered N<sup>W</sup> by W<sup>W</sup> the men employed in fitting scrub brooms & other jobs & boat to ship

L. B. O. 17.10 N Long 148.01 W

Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a light breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> steering N<sup>W</sup> by W<sup>W</sup> all hands employed in mending & main repair after 4 P M sent the main repair down to bend to rother & sent the main repair up forward fine pleasant weather nothing in night

L. B. O. 18.53 N Long 150.16 W

Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a light breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> ship steered N<sup>W</sup> all hands employed in mending & four repair fine weather L. B. O. 18.15 N Long 150.15 W

Thursday 17<sup>th</sup>

This day commences with a light breeze from the N<sup>W</sup> first part steered N<sup>W</sup> the last part steered W by N broke out weather & fill of lack of salt water 50 bbl & broke out the old four sail & after 4 P M bent it & but the other below fine pleasant weather
