

Remarks on board Barque Tamerlane, N. Baffin 1866
May Sunday 27th

First part of this day begins with a stormy breeze from the SSW to middle part the same last part the wind haul to the eastward thick hazy weather two fire racks in sight the men employed in ship duty

No Vls To Day
Monday 28th

First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the south middle part the same last part rainy part of the harbor side four-tyment back-lace thick hazy weather nothing in sight

Lat by Vls 35.34. S Long 172.26. W
Tuesday 29th

This day begins with a light breeze from the SW steering ship N 88 W thick fog & sun rain all night on the men employed in ship duty kept one hog 10 l

No Vls To Day
Wednesday 30th

First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the eastward middle part the wind haul to the SW thick fog last part a gale at 11 P M took in the light sails at board 2 P M double reef the top-sails & took in jib & mainsail & then reef the four top-sails at 11 P M took in the four-sail & close reef main top-sail at 11 P M hauled the ship to the wind under close reef main top-sail & four-tyment stay-sail (bad sea on last part clear

Remarks on board Barque Tamerlane of New Bedford 1866
May Thursday 31st

First part of this day begins with a heavy gale from the westward ship & sailing to heading & bent SW under close reef main top-sail middle part the same last part moderate to board 5 P M set four top-sails & then one reef out & set mainsail & jib at 11 P M set main top-sails thick rainy weather & bad sea on night & few seal land times

No Vls To Day
Friday 1st

June First part of this day begins with a brisk wind from the SW steering N 88 W thick & rainy middle part the wind lamer and N. by W with a heavy gale last part the ship under close reef four & main top-sail blowing heavy in squalls & bad sea on part two lumps of water in the end

Lat by Vls 40.42 S no Long to day
Saturday 2nd

First part of this day begins with a heavy gale from the SW ship heading SW under close reef top-sails at 1 P M took in the four top-sail middle & last part the same & very bad sea on plenty of rain squalls hard times land yet to long

Lat by Vls 41.18 S no Long to day
Sunday 3rd

First part of this day commences with a heavy gale from the W & W ship heading N W under close reef main top-sail middle part the same & last part moderate to board 5 P M set four top-sails & four-sail at 6 P M set double reef top-sails mainsail & jib heavy in squalls & bad sea on at 11 P M took in jib & mainsail & then reef the top-sails sun rain
