This day commences with a light breeze from the S.W. steering N.W. by W at 7 A.M. saw land & points of the starboard bow 50 miles of it. At 172 leagues made a last part light on broke out forward between decks & put 4 dip of water forward some new main top sail braces & a new whip to get the sail halard's one sail in night fine pleasant weather the men employed in ship duty

First part of this day begins with a calm at board 12 A.M. a light breeze sprung up from the N.E. then steered N.W. by W last part a board 4 knots breeze thick fog at 6 P.M. commence breaking out the main hatches for water fill the butt & two pits & put them all on on each side aft & fill 4 casks with salt water I don't get through till seven ship stands in night all sail on the ship very smooth all hands hard to work Heavy cold & fog
