

Remarks on board Barque Jarnacane of 1866
 July Saturday 21st 22

This day commences with a light breeze from the N. the ship is working to round the ice fine weather & ship in sight no whales spoke the ship going very quickly the men employed in ship duty

Lat. N. 68. 12. W Long 173. 08. W
 Sunday 22nd

This day commences with a light breeze from the eastward blowing to land in the ice clear weather 21 sails in sight one to boiling no whales spoke ship still left flags nothing plenty of ice

No Whales Day
 Monday 23rd

This day begins with a light breeze from the eastward the ship is working to round the ice but no whales 12 ships in sight to boiling clear weather Lat. N. 69. 59. W Long 173. 22. W

Tuesday 24th

This day commences with a light breeze from the eastward midly a light fast to Morate gale the ship in distance tack to working to round the ice at 4 P.M. saw one bow head & heard three boats & have been till 2 P.M. then came on board with out success it was a gale before we came on board 12 in sight men say a very fog

No Whales Day
 Wednesday 25th

This day commences with a Morate gale from the eastward midly fast Morate last fast strong breeze of thick fog all day ship under double reef at night 12 ships in sight 6 sails in the fog till 2 P.M. the ship beating to the eastward on 6 hours tack of the ice & then of

 July Thursday 26th

This day commences with a strong breeze from the eastward ship in distance tack working to the eastward in thick fog saw one bow head at 11 A.M. the fog lifted up for the first time for three days & we found some ice surrounded with ice & then we went to work to get out so ends this day with hard luck

Lat. N. 70. 09. W Long 174. 00. W
 Friday 27th

This day begins with a light breeze from the N. the ship is working out on the ice at 5 P.M. the wind left us & the ship was to land & turn her bows from the ice & then we heard 4 boats & rode 4 hours & at the ship of to land 2 to mile & then came on board midly fast light last fast strong breeze & then steam & broke out water & ship in sight & none to boiling clear weather all hands hard to work No Whales Day

Saturday 28th

This day begins with a strong breeze from the N. rain in morning & hailing all three this day till 3 P.M. with salt water of 6 miles & last fast light & clear broke out forward between decks & ship & two to boiling ship working to the N. & long the ice no gale fast times

Lat. N. 70. 12. W
 Sunday 29th

This day begins with a light breeze from the N. & ship heading to the eastward all sail out it rain & bound 16 hours this day & the great thick fog & ship in sight

No Whales Day
 Monday 30th

This day begins & ends with thick fog you land see two ships land this day & light breeze from the N. & ship in distance tack all sail on no bow head
