

Remarks on Board Barque Jernettane of New, N. H. 1866
 August Saturday 16th

Kind part of this day begins with a moderate gale from the N. E. with light land part later saw a few heads & going quick to the westward plenty of ripsacks found two boats but could not get fast broke and watered & fill two larks with salt water sent down the 2nd & 3rd fairsail & boat & mother all on a board half the time thick fog the men employed in ship duty

Lat by Obs 67.51.18 Long 171.57.14
 Sunday 17th

This day commences with a light breeze from the eastward steering N. N. W. at 9 A. M. saw three bow heads at 9 P. M. heard the harbor boats but it was dark before the whales came up laid to back all night at daylight went all to round the compass but saw nothing only ripsacks one sail in night so ends this day

Lat by Obs 67.43.18 Long 171.55.34
 Monday 20th

This day begins with a light breeze from the eastward ship at working to the eastward fine clear weather bent to new mainsail & main staysail & main to gamsail & jib two sails in night the men employed in ship duty nothing in night only heard heads

Lat by Obs 68.02.18 Long 172.22.14
 Tuesday 21st

This day begins with a light breeze from the N. E. ship on distance tracks & looking for whales to board half the time thick fog to board half the time to laying to back land find no bow heads this is what I call land track the men employed in ship duty No Lat to Day

 Wednesday 22nd

This day begins with a light breeze from the eastward ship on distance tracks thick hazy weather laying to back through the night saw ripsacks the men employed in ship duty so ends this day

Lat by Obs 68.22.18 Long 174.50.14
 Thursday 23rd

This day commences with a light breeze from the south ship at working northward & eastward find land thick fog land part & moderate rain land see more than 2 miles no part of the time this makes 4 day thick fog & rainy the men employed in ship duty so ends this day

No Lat to Day
 Friday 24th

Kind part of this day begins with a light breeze from the eastward with fast the same land part to moderate gale first 6 hours it rains at 6 A. M. double reef the four staysail at 9 A. M. double reef the main & took in the mainsail & had sea on two sails in night first part thick fog nothing in night the men employed in ship duty

Lat by Obs 67.50.18 Long 174.24.14
 Saturday 25th

Kind part of this day begins with a moderate gale from the westward ship under double reef staysails & four & aft sails with a land part the same of the Barque Eagle S. H. Trident in night the men employed in ship duty S. B. C. 67.49.18 Long 174.24.34

Sunday 26th

This day begins with a light breeze from the N. N. W. ship on distance tracks in the time saw one bow head & P. M. heard the harbor boats but he went faster than the boat he went N. W. by the compass two sails in night clear weather land track
