

Remarks on board barque Tamerlane of New Bedford  
October 1866  
Sunday 14<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a strong breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. with all sail set & steady rain. Middle & last part the same fine pleasant weather. The men employed in ship duty.

Lat by Obs. 59.57. N Long 159.37 W  
Monday 15<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day begins with a light breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. with all sail on the ship. Middle & last part a moderate gale at 2 P.M. took in the light sails at 5 P.M. double reef the staysails at 10 P.M. took in the main sail & put in rain in squalls. The men employed in ship duty.

Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> Lat by Obs. 57.59. N Long 159.00 W  
This day begins with a smart gale from the N.W. steering S.E. under double reef staysails at 5 P.M. hauled all hands & took in the four staysails & foresail & gave wing the main staysail & set the four reef sails. Middle & last part a heavy gale with very high sea on board the water broke & four of the crew got ship a good deal of water run rain hard times the men all to work.

No Lat To Day  
Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day begins with a heavy gale from the N.W. steering S.E. under double reef main staysails at 4 P.M. it begins to moderate & then we made sail to larder. Middle & last part a heavy gale middle part took in all sail at daylight and then reef staysails & foresail very equally & had sea on broke and water nothing in sight.

Lat by Obs. 55.14. N Long 157.11 W

Thursday 18<sup>th</sup>

This day begins & ends with a light breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. with all sail on the ship. Middle & last part a moderate gale at 2 P.M. took in the light sails at 5 P.M. double reef the staysails at 10 P.M. took in the main sail & put in rain in squalls. The men employed in ship duty.

No Lat To Day  
Friday 19<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day begins with a heavy gale from the N.W. steering S.E. under double reef staysails at 5 P.M. hauled all hands & took in the four staysails & foresail & gave wing the main staysail & set the four reef sails. Middle & last part a heavy gale with very high sea on board the water broke & four of the crew got ship a good deal of water run rain hard times the men all to work.

Lat by Obs. 55.50. N Long 156.29 W  
Saturday 20<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with a light breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. with all sail on the ship. Middle & last part a moderate gale at 2 P.M. took in the light sails at 5 P.M. double reef the staysails at 10 P.M. took in the main sail & put in rain in squalls. The men employed in ship duty.

Lat by Obs. 54.55. N Long 156.07 W  
Sunday 21<sup>st</sup>

This day begins with a calm middle part a light breeze springing up from the eastward & then steering S.E. with all sail on the ship. Middle & last part a moderate gale at 2 P.M. took in the light sails at 5 P.M. double reef the staysails at 10 P.M. took in the main sail & put in rain in squalls. The men employed in ship duty.
