Tamerlane of New Bedford

Sunday Jan 6th 1869
First part light variable winds
heading on different tacks
latter part light airs & calms
Lat 13:42

Monday Jan 7th
corn with calms latter part light
air from different quarters Lat 14:02
Long 149:09

Tuesday Jan 8th
corn with breeze from NE heading
E & SE employed Taring & pitting
digging latter part strong winds from
NNW with heavy squalls of rain & wind
making & taking in sail heading NE
No obs

Wednesday Jan 9th
begins with wind from NW with
squalls of wind & rain course NE
latter part the same No obs

Thursday Jan 10th
corn with strong wind from NW
to N with heavy squalls wind & rain
heading NE to SE at times top gallant
sails blew down then set them
again latter part wind from NW
N with squalls took in light sails
split main top sail double
reefed the top sails heading
NE to E so ends

Friday Jan 11th 1869
corn with wind from NW to
NE with squalls of wind & rain
heading NE to E latter part wind from
N to NE with squalls of wind & rain
heading NE to SE under double
reefed top sails & courses revent main
top sail & bent a rather No obs

Saturday Jan 12th
First part moderate wind from
NE with squalls of wind & rain
heading SE by the wind till
6 PM more ship to the N
latter part wind & weather the same
at noon wore ship to the Eastward

Sunday Jan 13th
First part wind from NE with squalls
wind & rain ship under double reefed
top sails & courses heading SE till 7 PM
wore ship to the NW latter part
wind from NE with fair weather
at noon tacked Eastward

Monday Jan 14th
corn with moderate winds from NE weather
good heading E & SE under all sail latter part
wind from NE with pleasant weather heading
NNW under all sail so ends
Lat 44:45
Long 144:40
