

Remarks on board Barque

Friday Jan 25th 1867
begins with fresh wind from
N^W with squalls heading ESE double
reefed top sails employed repairing
main sail later part more moderate
heading ESE

Saturday Jan 26th
begins with strong winds from
N^W heading ESE under all finished
main sail & bent it without main
top gallant sail & bent down one
later part strong wind from N^W at
noon tacked to the N^W under all sail

Sunday Jan 27th
First part strong wind from N^W
heading N^W later part wind fresh
from N^W with fair weather heading N^W

Monday Jan 28th
corn with moderate winds from N^W with
good weather heading N^W saw 7 whales
tween to windward later part wind &
weather the same heading on opposite
tacks
Lat 11:06
Long 138:53

Tuesday Jan 29th
these 24 hours begins with moderate
wind from N^W with fair weather
heading N^W middle part on opposite
tacks later part heading N^W at 9th we
made the land Island Magdalena
bearing N dist 30 miles one vessel in
sight

Journal of New Bedford

Wednesday Jan 30th 1867
strong wind from ESE heading
N Magdalena Island bore N by E
saw 4 whales lowered Bouts & South
struck saved 2 lost one by line party
took them along side at 5:30 PM
corn cutting finished at 10 PM
more ship to the SE made sail
later part wind from ESE heading
on opposite tacks Magdalena I bore
N by E clearing away Heads saw one
vessel in sight chasing whales got
none we saw whales going quick
to the windward did not follow

Thursday Jan 31st
strong winds from ESE heading
on opposite tacks one vessel in
sight like mine the land
employed hoisting clearing up deck
at sunset took in sail later
part strong wind from ESE
heading on opposite tacks

Friday Feb 1st
corn with fresh wind from
ESE heading on opposite
tacks I lost of Magdalena
in sight employed hoisting
at 10 PM finished hoisting made about
40 bbls later part wind from
E to N heading on opposite tacks
weather squally Magdalena I
in sight bearing N by E dist 40 miles
