

Remarks on board Barque

Saturday Feb 2nd 1867
Came with changeable winds & weather
heading on opposite tacks Magdalena
I.S.L. in sight employed at various sails
latter part wind from N.E. heading on
opposite tacks under all sail

Sunday Feb 3rd
begins wind from N.E. with good
weather cruising around Magdalena I.S.L.
one vessel in sight latter part strong
wind from N.E. cruising off Magdalena I.S.L.
vessel in sight split Feb hint down on

Monday Feb 4th
First part strong wind from N.E. weather
good cruising off Magdalena I.S.L.
at 4 P.M. spoke B.D. Wood 20 blbls
latter part wind & weather the same
stowed down 43 blbls. S. oil

Tuesday Feb 5th
Came with strong wind from N.E.
with fair weather heading on opposite
tacks latter part wind & weather
the same

Wednesday Feb 6th
begins with fresh wind from N.E.
heading N till 4 P.M. then W by N
at 5 P.M. saw Magdalena I.S.L.
bearing W by N 4 miles vessel in
sight employed in ship duty
latter part strong wind from N.E. at
7 P.M. steering on for the I.S.L. so on

Journal of cruising off Magdalena

Thursday Feb 7th 1867
Came with strong breeze from N.E.
at 1 P.M. close in shore one vessel lying
to anchor Capt. T. went on shore
to trade & order wood to be cut brought
200 lbs loads of hammocks & coconuts
at 4 P.M. Capt. came on board steering
by the wind under all sail at
noon set shorten sail latter part made
good on ship heading N

Friday Feb 8th
Came with strong wind from N.E.
heading on opposite tacks at noon set
shorten sail latter part wind & weather
the same cruising off Magdalena I.S.L.
at 4 P.M. made all sail employed in
ship duty

Saturday Feb 9th
First part fresh breezes from N.E. with
fair weather cruising off Magdalena
I employed at various sails at noon
set shorten sail latter part wind
& weather the same at 6 P.M. made
all sail heading on opposite tacks

Sunday Feb 10th
these 24 hours begins with strong
breezes from N.E. weather good cruising
off Magdalena I.S.L. one vessel in
sight latter part wind & weather
the same heading on opposite
