

Remarks on board Barque Tamer Case of New Bedford cruising

Monday Feb 18 1867
 com with gentle breezes from ENE &
 Pleasant cruising off Magdalena I. S. S.
 at sun set shorten sail latter part
 strong wind from NE heading on
 opposite tacks employed Cooper
 & sawing down oil I. S. S. in sight

Tuesday Feb 19th
 begins with strong wind from
 NE heading on opposite tacks
 sawing down oil at 6 P.M.
 finished sawing down 82
 of oil John cut his foot latter
 part wind & weather same

Wednesday Feb 20th
 com with strong winds from NE
 with squally weather heading on
 opposite tacks double reefed top
 sails latter part wind & weather
 the same

Thursday Feb 21st
 first part winds fresh from NE
 heading on opposite tacks under
 double reefed top sails on vessel
 on sight Cooper repairing sculls
 but latter part wind & weather
 the same till the morning

Friday Feb 22nd
 first part moderate wind from NE
 cruising round Magdalena I. latter part
 the same spoke Dan. Wood

Saturday Feb 23rd 1867
 com with moderate wind from
 NE with fair weather cruising off
 Magdalena I. one vessel in sight
 finished minnies latter part strong
 winds from NE steering different courses
 saw Dan. Wood take 2 Whales along
 side so ends

Sunday Feb 24th
 at first part strong winds & squally
 at 2 P.M. saw Whales lowered 3 boats
 all struck all dead lost run of
 one Boat lit 3 large Whales go
 abouts went on board look
 for lost Boat at night pup under
 easy sail at 6 P.M. saw 1 Boat
 with Whale took him along
 side cut him in made all to
 look for lost Whales in company
 with Dan Wood saw nothing

Monday Feb 25th
 com with strong winds from NE
 at 4 P.M. saw Dan. Wood heading
 saw lowered Boats & Whales going
 quick get on took him along
 side at 8 P.M. Amashon took 2
 Whales com to cut to rub lit him
 lay along side all night com to hoil
 at day light com to cut finished
 at 7 made sail heading SE
 till noon more ship to the N
