

Remarks on board Bark Tamerlane

Tuesday Feb 26th 1867
com with strong winds from NW
weather fair at 2 PM saw one of
our whales we first took him
& cut him blasted but a little
Made sail to top sails hoisting
2 vessels in sight then cutting
latter part gentle breeze from SE
heading on opposite tack employed
hoisting one vessel in sight

Wednesday Feb 27th
begins with moderate winds from
NW with fair weather cruising
off Magdalena I & L employed hoisting
at 6 PM finished hoisting latter part
wind the same on opposite tack

Thursday Feb 28th
com with gentle breezes from
SE heading on opposite tack
employed at various jobs
Magdalena I & L in sight latter
part wind & weather same com
rowing down oil form

Friday Mar 1st
begins with moderate wind from
SE cruising off Magdalena I
finished stowing down 50 bbls
Sail latter part strong winds from
SE at 4 AM heading N at 7 AM steering
in for Magdalena I bent chains got
anchors & bows at noon 9 1/2 miles off

cruising South round Magdalena I

Saturday March 2nd 1867
com with strong winds from NW at
1 PM came to anchor in 15 fathoms
water hauled anchor broke out for
casks for water sent them on shore
latter part at day light fetched of
water 17 casks sent another on shore
employed stowing water down lower

Sunday Mar 3rd
com with strong wind from
SE employed getting off water
sent down 160 bbls water
latter part men on liberty

Monday Mar 4th
wind from NW with fine weather
employed getting off water & stowing
it away saving down dead stays

Tuesday Mar 5th
com with fine weather employed
stowing down water & wood
latter part getting off wood

Wednesday Mar 6th
begins with fine weather employed
getting off wood & stowing away
latter part the same

Thursday Mar 7th
this begins with strong wind &
& squally employed getting off wood & c
cutting it & stowing it away
