

Remarks on board Barque Tamerlane

Friday Mar 4th 1867

This Day begins with wind from NE & Pleasant we have get off 14 Boats loads of wood ⁱⁿ after part get off 2 Boat loads wood

Saturday Mar 5th

This Day begins with wind from NE & Pleasant getting off wood 2 Boats after 12 noon Boats get back with hogs get all to 20 B loads wood

Sunday Mar 10th

This Day squally men on liberty
Shaner went to sea

Monday Mar 11th

corn wind from NE with fair weather ship all for sea John Davis a stow way from Honolulu swim a shore in the night latter part strong wind from N with squalls of rain corn to get under way wind to muter on shore so ends

Tuesday Mar 12th

First part calm latter part wind from N with squally weather hove 30 fathoms chain ship dragged her anchor paid out chain again waiting for fair wind

Wednesday Mar 13th

begins with wind from N at 3 PM get under way employed stowing anchors run bent chain stowed them away course SE shaped our men

Miss Lou Master of New Bedford a native boat flew the anchor later part wind from the Northward cruising off Magdalena I saw vessel in sight

Thursday Mar 14th

corn with strong wind from N cruising off Magdalena I ship under light sail latter part wind from NE cruising off Magdalena I employed repairing Sails

Friday Mar 15th

begins with moderate wind from NE cruising off Magdalena I saw vessel in sight run bent fore top sail & bent other repairing Sails latter part wind & weather the same finished Sails saw 2 Whales at 11 AM hauled Boats

Saturday Mar 16th

first part strong wind from N get 3 Whales took them a long side at 3 PM cut them in finished at 10 PM cleared up decks set watch latter part wind from N with squalls of rain employed clearing away the Heads

Sunday Mar 17th

begins with moderate wind from N cruising off Magdalena I corn hailing latter part wind from NE employed hailing
