

Remarks on board Barque Fairweather of New Bedford 1867

Monday Mar 18th 1867
begins with wind from NE cruising
off Magdalena I employed hoiling
Latter part Moderate wind from NE
finished hoiling

Tuesday Mar 19th
Came with Moderate wind from
NE with fine weather cruising
off Magdalena I employed
Spiracles Jabs Latter part light
baffling winds & Pleasant com-
coopering oil heading. Oppose
tacks

Wednesday Mar 20th
begins with baffling winds
cruising off Magdalena I stowed
down 8 fbls I oil Latter part
gentle breeze from NNE cruising

Thursday Mar 21st
Came with small breezes from NNE
to N with squalls of rain course
I Latter part wind & weather the
same cruising off Magdalena
I employed repairing fore top rail

Friday Mar 22nd
First part gentle breezes from N
cruising off Magdalena I repairing
sails saw Black Fish Latter part
light air from various points cruising
off Magdalena I

Saturday Mar 23rd
Came with small breezes from various
points cruising off Magdalena I
employed repairing sails sent up
studding sails Booms were set Took
in light sails Latter part wind &
weather the same so ends

Sunday Mar 24th
begins with light air cruising
off Magdalena I employed in ship
duty Latter part light air from SW
made all sail course NNE &
I S L bearing NNE

Monday Mar 25th
Came with small breezes from
W to SW course by N to NE
Magdalena I hove at 7 PM 4
dist 8 leagues Latter part light
baffling winds & very fair weather
heading on opposite tacks at 7 AM
took in harbor anchor & stocked
a spare one put on the boom painted
I Boat and other Jabs so ends

Tuesday Mar 26th
Came with small breeze from N heading
WNE by the wind under all sail
employed in ship duty at 7 PM Magdalena
I hove W by N dist 9 leagues Latter part
changeable wind & squally weather
heading W to N by W Magdalena I
in sight bearing S by E
