

Remarks on board Barque

Wednesday Mar 27th 1867
First part Moderate wind from N
heading N to NW & under all sail.
painting 1 Boat employed at various
jobs Magdalen I bore 1 dist 12 leagues
latter part wind from N & steering
NW by the wind at 7 AM # Flood
1 in & two more

Thursday Mar 28th
then 24 hours light happing
& fair weather heading NW by N
sent fore spencer gaff at sun
3 PM in sight one bearing N
off one 1 latter part wind & weather
the same at 5 AM 1 in sight head
N put up breast back stays
steering NW by the wind repairs
Main Royal

Friday Mar 29th
came with small breezes from NE &
fair weather steering N by W & NW
by the wind under all sail employed
in ship duty latter part strong wind from
NNW heading NW to NNW under all
sail 1 20 ends

Saturday Mar 30th
came with strong winds from NE &
& Pleasant heading NW employed in
ship duty Painted Waist Boat
latter part wind & weather the same
heading NW Painted B Boat

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Sunday Mar 31st 1867
First part Moderate wind from NE
with fair weather heading NW under
all sail 1 vessel in sight latter part
wind & weather the same course N

Monday April 1st
these 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from
NW with fair weather course N under all sail
latter part wind from E course N at 7 AM
saw quite a number of Humpbacks hauled up
for them took them for sperm whales
kept off & set Top Mast studding sail

Tuesday Apr 2nd
Commences with gentle breezes from E & Pleasant
course N employed at various jobs latter part
wind & weather the same course N

Wednesday Apr 3rd
came with Moderate winds from E
course N employed in ship duty
men packing out slops latter part
small breeze lowered twice for
blackfish got none

Thursday Apr 4th
begins with strong wind from
NE course NW under all sail
took in Laboard Boat put a
nother latter part wind weather the same
get out water 3 casks fore Hale
