

Remarks on board Barque Tamerlane of Gen Bedford Bonnell

Friday April 5th 1869

First part small breeze from NE with fair weather
course NE by E employed in ship's duty
Latter part strong wind from NE course
NE by E

Saturday Apr 6th

Came with fresh wind from NE with squally
weather course NE by E repaired gaff top sail ship
under all sail latter part wind from NE with
heavy squalls course NE by E carried away head
mizzen top mast the pound 2 inches of
sawd wood sent mast down gaff top
sail Mizzen top mast stay sail

Sunday Apr 7th

From 24 hours begins with strong winds
from NE with squally weather course
NE under all sail employed at various
jobs latter part wind & weather the same
course NE

Monday Apr 8th

Came with strong wind from NE
with squally weather course NE
latter part wind & weather the same
course NE

Tuesday Apr 9th

begins with fresh wind from NE
course NE under all sail repairing
main top gallant sail latter part
wind & weather the same course
NE

Wednesday Apr 10th 1869

First part strong wind from NE with
good weather ~~weather~~ course NE by E
latter part wind from NE with
squally weather course NE by E under
all sail repaired fore top gallant sail

Thursday Apr 11th

Came with strong wind from NE
with squally weather course NE
at 7 PM shorten sail ship
beats 656 strokes in 24 hours
latter part moderate winds from NE
course NE made all sail

Friday Apr 12

begins with moderate wind from
NE course NE to NE by E at
1 PM sail east part of Hawaii
S.E. at 10 PM hauled a back
heading NE latter part wind
& weather the same at 7 PM
kept off 1 PM by 1 PM made sail
running down between Hawaii &
Moued chariel Bound to Tochi
for Patates

Saturday Apr 13th

Came with strong wind from NE
with squally weather steering different
courses at 7 PM came off Tochi double
reup top sails hauled in show with head yards
slack latter part heading on opposite
tacks till 6 PM kept off for Tochi
at 10 PM came to anchor in 7 fathoms
water
