

Bark Farmerlane Cruising On Kodiak

Monday June 5-1867

Small baffling airs and calms
busy repairing sails at 12 midnight
got a breeze from S.W. Steered N.E. repaired the
fore top sail

Tuesday June 6

Small breeze from S.W. to S fine weather Steered
N.E. see two fin backs miedell sent the
same latter ~~latter~~ part under way to
East and freshened on at 8 A.M. see
a right whale lowered Boat Boat got
close to shoot a bomb lance in to him Boat
steerer never started soon after La Boat.
went on whal see the Boat at 11 A.M.
come on Board and followed the whale
with the ship going N by W
Lat 45° 40' N Long 144° 28' W

Wednesday June 7

Brisk gales from the cloudy weather
still chasing the above whale with
the ship going N by W at 4 P.M. double
reefed last run of the whale at 7 P.M.
raining miedell part strong galls
with rain latter part moderate made
sail accorden

Thursday June 8

moderate breeze from E.S.E. foggy
steered North miedell and latter
part the same at 8 A.M. see several
right whales lowered W Boat
Darter did not get fast

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Sunday June 9-1867

fresh breezes from E.N.E. foggy weather
Ship on different tacks at 6 P.M. lowered
again B Boat Darter did not get fast
miedell and latter part small breeze thick
weather

Lat 57° 33' N
Lon 144° 22' W

Monday June 10

Small breezes from N.E. hazy weather Ship on
different tacks see one right whale lowered
without success miedell part the same latter
part fresh breezes from N.W. Steered N.E. at 9 A.M.
see a ship sailing

Lat By Obs 58° - 10' N
Lon By Chron. 143° - 27' W

Tuesday June 11

fresh breezes from W by S cloudy weather Ship on
different tacks a cruising see a number of fin backs
miedell and latter part the same

Lat By Obs 57° 25' N
Lon By Chron. 143° - 47' W

Wednesday June 12

fresh breezes from S.W. cloudy weather
at 2 P.M. see two right whales lowered at 7
P.M. Boat struck thick fog whal run
Bad to windward cut line at 8.30 come
on Board shortened sail for strength
miedell and latter part thick fog

Thursday June 13

Small breezes from S.W. thick fog
Ship by the wire on different tacks
continued the same throughout
these 24 hours at 9 A.M. gunned
Ship General Scott Washburn Master
had struck three whales got nothing
