Wednesday Sept. 4. 1867

Strong breeze from E. S. E. cloudy
Ship in between St. Pauls & St. Georges
At 3 PM lowered for right Whales
L. Boat got one at 7 PM got three to the
Ship midall just freshened on to a
Strong gales latter part gale
increasing veered the Whale out on
the weather Bow

Thursday Sept. 5

Strong gales from E. S. E. with rain Ship
Laying to head to the N with a Whale along
side at 12 midnight the gale broke
latter part small breeze with thick fog
commenced cutting

Friday Sept. 6

Small breezes from E. S. E. to S stormy
weather at 4 PM finished cutting
more Ship heave. W started boiling
midall and latter part strong
breezes Ship on different tacks

Saturday Sept. 7

Strong breezes from S. E. foggy weather
Ship heaving to the E. S. E. busy boiling
See a Bark to windward midall and
latter part the same same
hauled the Brigg. The whale of Santa
Islands Talar Master has been
in company with us all the time
we have been taking five Whales
he has taken nothing

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Sunday Sept. 8 - 1867

fresh breezes from S. S. E. cloudy weather
Ship by the wind to the East continued
the same through out these 24 hours

Monday Sept. 9

fresh breezes from S. S. E. stormy weather Ship by
the wind on different tacks busy boiling at 5
PM Shortened sail to a close reefed main
top sail started 86 barrels of Oil in to
the Tanks midall just the same latter part
calm fine weather busy stowing
Oil in after hatch

Tuesday Sept. 10

Small airs from N fine weather
Steered E. S. E. Stowed 108 bbl of Oil
in after hold busy at boiling midall
part small breeze latter part strong breeze
at 5 AM see St. Pauls Is. bearing E. Dis.
20 miles at 7 AM Steered S. E. at 11 see
three ships Steered for them at 11 see a
right Whale

Wednesday Sept. 11

Brisk gales from N. W. squally weather
Ship by the wind to the S. W. at 1 PM
Lowered for the Whales come on so had
come on Board at 6 PM close reefed
midall and latter part the same
finished boiling at 9 AM the two
last Whales turned up 897 barrels
