ends with strong squalls
So Ends

Sunday Feb 2nd 1868
Commenced with
fine weather at 5 Pm a hard
squall split the fore Middle
part fine last part squally
split the Main Top sail
So Ends

Monday Feb 3rd 1868
Begins with
squally weather at 6 Pm spoke
Bark Benjamin Cummings
nothing this Cruise
Middle and last parts fine
weather So Ends

Tuesday Feb 4th 1868
These 24 hours fine
clear weather land in sight
water employed repairing
sails at 5¹/₂ Pm spoke
and gained with Bark
Amathons Capt Norton
75 Bbls Spum this Cruise
So Ends

Wednesday Feb 5th 1868
Begins with
good weather land in sight
Employed repairing fore
Middle and last parts
the same So Ends

Thursday Feb 6th 1868
Begins and
ends with a fresh breeze
from N. E. three sail
in sight
So Ends
