Tuesday April 7th 1868
 These 24 hours
 fine weather at 3 PM Capt
 Winslow came on board also
 Second mate Steward and
 two Seamen all shipped
 at this date at 4 PM made
 sail and steered to the S.W.
 So Ends

Wednesday April 8th 1868
 These 24 hours
 the same as the last at
 11 AM came to anchor at
 Wynoo Bay At 1 PM boat
 went on shore brought
 off 3 Boolek hay sweet Potatoes
 Fowl and one large hog
 So Ends

Thursday April 9th 1868
 Begins and
 ends with good weather
 all hands employed
 getting off Receipts Potatoes
 Onions Tarron Cabbage Fowl
 Eggs &c at 9 PM got under
 way and steered to the
 west last part employed
 stowing Anchors and Chain
 So Ends

Yamashone Bound to Kodiak

Friday April 10th 1868
 Begins and
 ends with good weather ship
 steering to the N.W. and East
 So Ends

Saturday April 11th 1868
 Begins and ends
 with wind and fog ship
 steering to the N.W.
 So Ends

Sunday April 12th 1868
 Commences
 with wind N.W. a fresh gale
 much rain ship under storm
 sail at 10 PM split
 lower edge of Main Top sail
 wind backed to the N.E.
 So Ends.

Monday April 13th 1868
 Still a fresh
 gale with rain at
 6 PM furlled Main Top sail
 So Ends

Tuesday April 14th 1868
 Begins with
 a fresh gale hnt down
 Top sail and our best one
 So Ends
