

Bound to Bristol Bay

Thursday July 16th 1868
 Begins with
 a light breeze from N. E. W.
 Middle and last part
 wind West at 10 Am saw
 a Whale to windward
 lowered 3 boats without
 success

So Ends

Friday July 17th
 These 24 hours
 the same as the last last
 part employed putting in
 ballast saw two Whales
 going quick to windward
 So Ends

Saturday July 18th
 Begins with light
 baffling winds from W to
 S W in played in the whal
 So Ends

Sunday July 19th 1868
 Begins with
 a fresh breeze from the
 West ship on different tacks
 Middle and last part some
 So Ends

Monday July 20, 1868
 These 24 hours
 the same as the last
 So Ends

Bound to Bristol Bay

Tuesday July 21. 1868
 Begins and
 ends with wind from N. E. W.
 to S. W. ship and different
 tacks saw the land to the
 N W dist about 75 miles
 So Ends

Wednesday July 22. 1868
 Begins with wind
 West ship heading N. E. W.
 by the Wind land in sight
 Last part wind S. W. thick
 fog ship steering by the wind
 heading N. E. W.
 So Ends

Thursday July 23. 1868
 Begins with
 wind S. E. W. ship steering
 W under all sail at 4 Am
 more ship and rounded got
 48 fathoms at 5 1/2 Am cleared
 saw the Island of Onamack
 Dist about six miles more
 ship and steered in at 6
 more off thick fog shortened
 sail at 5 Am fog lifted
 steered in for the passage
 with wind from S. E. W.
 So Ends
