

Remarks on Board Ship

Saturday November 31st 1843

commenced with fine weather employed getting ship ready for sea. Thirteenth and better part of the time. Natives employed at the end of the day. Nothing further.

Sunday Nov 22nd

commenced with calm and fine weather. Thirteenth and better part of the same so ends this day.

Monday Nov 23rd

commenced with fine weather fresh trade from E. at 8 am. employed twenty Natives to unmoor ship at 10 am all ready for sea waiting for Pilot at 3 pm Pilot who arrived for second better part of the same ship fast to the dock iron work to support. Staff rigging out had now made ashore so ends this day.

Tuesday Nov 24th

commenced with fine weather strong trade from E. ship fast to the dock ready for sea at 1 pm Pilot and part of the crew arrived employed six Natives to heave anchor ship out at 2 pm. Master said at 3 pm outside the Harbor. Latter part strong trade from E. double reefed the topsails and stood off and on so ends this day.
