

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickason, of
Civil time. Sunday Oct 27th 1861

Commenced, with a moderate, northeast-
trade wind. About one o'clock A M, took
a pilot, and came to an anchor, in the
harbor of Hilo, in about five fathoms
of water; furlled the sails &c. Middle,
and latter part, wind, & weather much the same
with an occasional shower of rain. Thus ends

Monday 28th

During these twenty-four hours, fine weather,
with moderate, northeast, trade winds. Employed
at getting fresh water, washing ship, &c.

Tuesday 29th

Forepart the prevailing land breeze latter part the
sea breeze or trades. The weather has been somewhat
showery during the day. Employed trimming
the ship, so as to repair the copper on her bows

Wednesday 30th

The greater part of these twenty-four hours
fine weather, with a moderate trade wind.
Employed repairing the copper, on the ships bows
doing ships duty generally &c. So ends the day

Thursday 31st

Fine weather with the usual winds
Employed at getting fresh water on board
The chief mate left here for Honolulu,
for medical aid. Still lying at Hilo

Friday Nov 1st

Light breezes with some showers. The
crew employed at getting fresh water &c

Bedford. Bored on a Cape Horn whaling voyage.

Saturday Nov 2nd 1861

The usual sea & land breeze, blowing quite
moderately during the day, with some rain.
One watch on liberty, on shore, the other
employed at ships duty generally.

Sunday 3rd

Cloudy and the forepart
raining with the usual land and sea breeze
The larboard watch ashore on liberty.

Monday 4th

Forepart a light land breeze with rain. Middle
somewhat rainy, with scarcely any wind. Latter
part a light land breeze with no rain. One
watch on shore the other getting off molasses &c.

Tuesday 5th

The breeze from off of the land has prevailed
for the greater part of the time during these
twenty-four hours. One watch on liberty, the
other employed at painting the ship on the outside

Wednesday 6th

Forepart fine weather with a moderate trade
wind. Latter part strong trades with some
rain. One watch on shore, on liberty,
the other employed at painting the ship

Thursday 7th

Forepart clear with a moderate sea breeze. One watch on liberty,
the other employed at painting ship. Middle part a fresh
sea breeze with rain which caused the ship to drag her anchor
some so we let go the other anchor. Latter part more moderate
