 Lat 45° 44' N Lon 153° 32' E Monday May 12th 1862

Middle strong southwesterly wind Steering
 N E Carrying all sail throughout the day

Lat 45° 01' Lon 151° 11' Tuesday 13th
 Forepart strong westerly winds latter part
 moderate southwesterly winds Carrying prudent
 sail and steering northeast throughout the day

Lat 50° 00' Lon 160° 39' Wednesday 14th
 Middle strong variable southwesterly winds
 Steering northeast Carrying prudent sail

Lat 51° 57' Lon 168° 41' Thursday 15th
 Forepart moderate westerly winds Steering N E
 Middle and latter part light westerly winds steering
 N E Carrying all sail lowered for a Siberian whale

Lat 52° 17' Lon 164° 38' Friday 16th
 Commences nearly calm Forepart a light northerly wind
 the ship heading E N E Middle a light westerly wind
 latter part a moderate northwesterly wind Steering N E
 Carrying all sail. lowered for a Siberian whale

Lat 53° 45' Lon 167° 11' Saturday 17th
 Moderate westerly winds Forepart steering N E, latter part
 steering E by N At 5 o'clock P.M. saw Copper island
 bearing about N E E, carrying all sail. Some spittings of snow

Latitude 55° 24' Sunday 18th
 Moderate variable northwesterly winds with some
 snow Steering N E Carrying all sail

Lat 57° 04' Lon 171° 48' Monday 19th
 Moderate variable southwesterly winds with some
 snow The ship under all sail. Forepart steering
 N E, latter part steering north

Bedford. Bound on a Cape Horn whaling voyage.

Lat 58° 30' N Lon 173° 06' E Tuesday May 20th 1862
 Moderate variable southwesterly winds Steering off with all sail

Lat 59° 25' Wednesday 21st
 Forepart light variable winds, working to the northward
 lowered two boats for the purpose of shooting finbacks
 latter part light easterly winds Steering N Carrying all sail

Lat 60° 44' Lon 174° 16' Thursday 22nd
 Forepart light easterly winds steering N At daylight
 saw land on the Kamtschatka shore bearing N E
 latter part working to the eastward carrying all sail

Lat 60° 28' Lon 175° 09' Friday 23rd
 Moderate variable northeasterly winds The ship
 on opposite tacks, by the wind Carrying all sail

No observation Saturday 24th
 Moderate variable northeasterly winds The ship under
 all sail, by the wind, on opposite tacks

Lat 61° 20' Sunday 25th
 Moderate and light, variable westerly winds. The ship
 working to the northward and eastward, towards Cape
 Staraviv, which is in sight, carrying all sail. Three sail in sight

Lat 62° 05' Monday 26th
 Commences with light southwesterly winds the ship
 under all sail steering N E About 4 P.M. came
 up to the ice and ran along the edge of it to the
 eastward Saw land near Cape Shadous latter part the
 ship on the eastern tack under short sail, quite a strong breeze

No observation Tuesday 27th
 Strong southwesterly winds with some fog. The ship
 under easy sail, on opposite tacks, off Cape Shadous
