

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of N Bedford.

Lat, $64^{\circ}35'$ north. Monday, Nov 18th 1863.
Light, variable, easterly winds. The ship under
full sail, working to the northeast, toward Cape
Navarino, which is in sight. Saw some ice.

Lat, $62^{\circ}04'$. Tuesday, 19th.
Light variable winds. The ship under all sail
working to the northeastward. At eight P.M., saw
Cape St. Thadens. Saw considerable scattering ice,
during the day. Spoke ship Champion of N Bedford.

Wednesday, 20th.
Moderate variable easterly winds. The ship under
easy sail, lying around in the ice, off Cape Navarino.
Thick, snowy weather, the greater part of the day.

Thursday, 21st.
Light variable easterly winds. The ship under necessary
sail, in the ice, near Cape Thadens. Caught two walrus.

Friday, 22nd.
Light, variable, northerly winds. The ship under short
sail, in the ice, in the vicinity of Cape St. Thadens.

Saturday, 23rd.
Light variable breezes. The ship under short sail,
in the ice about 40 miles N.E. from Cape St. Thadens.

Sunday, 24th.
Light, variable, winds, with some spittings of snow.
The ship under short sail, in the ice.

Monday, 25th.
Moderate variable southeasterly winds. The ship under
short sail, in, and around ice. Saw several vessels.

Tuesday, 26th.
Middling, strong, variable, southeasterly, winds. The
ship under short sail, in, and around ice, in the
Arctic Sea. Saw land on the western shore.

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of N B.

Wednesday, May 27th, 1863.
Moderate, variable, winds, with some snow. The ship
under short sail, in the ice, in the Arctic Sea.

Thursday, 28th.
Lat $63^{\circ}35'$ north.
Light, variable, westerly winds. The ship under requisite
sail, around the ice. Saw a bowhead whale, and lowered
two boats for it. In the company of the ships Keindeer,
and, Fabius, and bark Chamberlain, Sagoda & Barnstable, of N B.

Friday, 29th.
Lat $63^{\circ}40'$.
Light, variable, northwesterly winds. The ship under
necessery sail in and around ice in the Sea of Anadir.

Saturday, 30th 31st.
Lat $63^{\circ}42'$.
Light winds; forepart northwesterly, latter part
southerly. In, and around ice; under easy sail.

Sunday, 30th 31st.
Light variable southeasterly winds, with some
fog. The ship under requisite sail around the ice.

Monday, June 1st.
Lat $64^{\circ}00'$.
Light, easterly winds, with some fog. The ship under
requisite sail; in, and, around ice, in the Arctic Sea.

Tuesday, 2nd.
Light, variable, airs. The ship under necessary sail, in and
around the ice. Saw several whales, and lowered for them.

Wednesday, 3rd.
Middling strong, variable, winds. The ship
under short sail, around the ice, in the
Arctic Sea. Lowered for a bowhead whale.

Thursday, 4th.
Lat $64^{\circ}16'$.
Forepart light variable breezes; latter part, calm. The ship
under all sail; in, and, around ice. At 4 P.M. saw land,
bearing N.E., about 25 miles distant. Saw several
whales, and lowered for them, without success.
