

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of New Bedford.

Lat, 38° 14' N. Lon, 132° 18' W. Wednesday, October 14th 1863.
Light winds, principally from the southwestward,
hoisting all sail, and steering E by N, S, & E.

Lat, 38° 02' N. Lon, 130° 22' W. Thursday, 15th.
Forepart, light westerly winds; latter part, moderate
northwesterly winds. Under all sail; steering E by N, S, & E.

Lat, 38° 39' N. Lon, 126° 38' W. Friday, 16th.
Forepart, moderate northwesterly winds, under all sail
steering E by N. Latter part, middling strong variable
northerly winds. Steering east north east. At 9
AM lost some spar repairs, from over the taffrail.

Lat, 37° 31' N. Lon, 124° 25' W. Saturday, 17th.
Commences with strong northerly winds; the
ship under prudent sail, steering E by N. About
1 PM, hoist the ship to under close reefed
top sail, stagsail, and No. 1 spencer. At noon, steering
E by N with close reefed topsails and courses.
Latter part, moderate northwesterly winds; steering E by N.
with all sail. At 9 PM the *Carallone*, was seen, bearing E by N.

Sunday, 18th.
Light variable westerly winds; At 1 PM passed the
Carallone, steering E by N, and arrived off the bay
of San Francisco about 5 PM, then lay to back about
an hour, and took a pilot, and steered for the harbor of
San Francisco, came to an anchor there, at 1 PM.

Monday, 19th.
Light variable breezes. Employed at drying and
bundling bone. Sent the foreyard (which is broken) on deck.

Tuesday, 20th.
Light variable winds. Laying at an anchor at
San Francisco. Employed at drying and bundling bone.

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Wednesday, October 21st 1863.
Moderate and light northwesterly winds. The
ship laying anchored at St Francisco. Bundling whalebone.

Thursday, 22nd.
Light northwesterly winds. Laying anchored at St Francisco.

Friday, 23rd.
Light northwesterly winds. Laying at an anchor at San
Francisco. Employed at dashing the ship.

Saturday, 24th.
Light and moderate variable winds. About 5
PM took a tug-boat, hoist up the anchor, and went
alongside of Market Street Wharf.

Sunday, 25th.
Fine, with light, and moderate northwesterly
winds. Laying at Market st Wharf, San Francisco.

Monday, 26th.
Moderate, and light, northwesterly winds. Employed
at discharging oil for shipment per *Invincible* of 8 for Boston.

Tuesday, 27th.
Light northwesterly winds. Finished discharging oil (about 1000 bbls).

Wednesday, 28th.
Light northwesterly winds. Towed the ship with a steam-tug,
near to our former berth, at 10 PM, and came to an anchor.

Thursday, 29th.
Light northwesterly winds. Laying anchored at St Francisco.

Friday, 30th.
Moderate and middling strong variable westerly
winds. The ship laying at an anchor at San Francisco.

Saturday, 31st.
Middling strong northerly winds. The ship
laying at an anchor at San Francisco.
