

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of N. Bedford.

Lat, 22° 39' N. Thursday, January 7th 1864.
Forepart, and middle, muddling strong northerly winds. Latter part, the wind more moderate. The ship under prudent sail, on opposite tacks.

Lat 22° 46'. Friday, 8th.
Forepart moderate; latter middle, muddling strong northerly winds. Latter part moderate northerly winds with westerly variations. The ship under prudent sail working up the Gulf to the northward.

Lat, 23° 06'. Saturday, 9th.
Moderate northerly winds. The ship on opposite tacks, working up the Gulf of California, on the western side. Carrying all sail.

Lat, 23° 23'. Sunday, 10th.
Moderate, and light, northerly winds. The ship under all sail, working up the Gulf.

Lat, 23° 35'. Monday, 11th.
Moderate, and muddling strong, northerly winds. The ship under prudent sail. Working up the Gulf of California. Spoke, hermaphrodite brig, Franklin Adams, of S. Francisco.

Lat 23° 32' 4m, 109° 02' W. Tuesday, 12th.
Middling strong northwesterly winds. The ship under prudent sail, working up the Gulf.

Lat, 23° 50'. Wednesday, 13th.
Middling strong, and moderate, northwesterly winds. The ship under necessary sail, on opposite tacks, working up on the western side, of the Gulf of California. Employed at repairing boats, rigging, &c.

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of New Bedford.

Lat, 23° 26' N. 4m, 108° 11' W. Thursday, January 14th 1864.
Moderate northwesterly winds with some westerly variations. The ship under topsails, working up the Gulf of California; Saw the land on both sides, about 12 o'clock, M.

Lat, 23° 02'. Friday, 15th.
Moderate variable northwesterly winds. The ship under all sail working up the Gulf, to the northward. Saw two barks (merchantmen) one of which was lying at an anchor, near the eastern shore. Saw several whales, (devilfish and humpbacks).

Lat 24° 29'. Saturday, 16th.
Forepart moderate, northwesterly winds. Latter part, light variable winds. The ship under all sail working up the Gulf of Cal.

Sunday, 17th.
Forepart moderate, northwesterly winds; the ship on opposite tacks. About 1 P.M. when off the mouth of La Paz Bay, lowered three boats for blackfish. Latter part steering S. E. by E.

Lat, 23° 00'. Monday, 18th.
Middling strong, and moderate, northwesterly winds. Forepart steering S. E. by E; latter part on opposite tacks. The ship under necessary sail throughout the day.

Lat, 23° 01' 4m, 106° 58' W. Tuesday, 19th.
Moderate northwesterly winds. The ship under necessary sail on opposite tacks. About 10 A.M. saw land on the eastern side of the Gulf of California. Spoke the steamer Sierra Nevada, of San Francisco. Employed at repairing boats, rigging, &c. Saw a humpback whale.
