

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of New Bedford.

Friday, ~~the~~ April 1st 1864.
Middling strong, northeast, tradewinds.
The ship off and on at Honolulu,
Oahu. Carrying prudent sail. Sent a boat to the town.

Saturday, 2nd.
Light, moderate, and middling strong winds,
principally from the northeast. The ship
under requisite sail; off and on at Honolulu.

Sunday, 3rd.
Light and moderate, variable winds, and calms.
Under requisite sail; off and on at Honolulu, Oahu.

Monday, 4th.
Light and moderate variable winds, principally
from the northeast. Forepart and middle, off
and on, at Honolulu. At 6 P.M. captain Stewart
came on board. Latterpart steering about west,
for Hawaii. Carrying requisite sail throughout.

April 5th.
Light winds, principally from the southward.
The ship under all sail steering west by north.
About 10 A.M., saw Hawaii Island, ahead.

Wednesday 6th.
Commences with light northeasterly winds.
The ship under all sail, on opposite tacks.
At 11 A.M. came to with the port anchor, in ^{seven} ~~nine~~
fathoms of water, at Holoa (Hawaii). Latterpart variable winds.

Thursday, 7th.
Light, and moderate, variable winds. Laying at
an anchor, at Holoa. Employed at getting fresh water.

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Friday, April 8th 1864.
Light, variable winds. The ship laying at an anchor
at Holoa, Hawaii, Sandwich Islands. Employed
at getting on board fresh water, molasses, &c, &c.

Saturday, 9th.
Light and moderate, variable winds, with some
thunder and rain. Employed at getting fresh water.

Sunday, 10th.
Light variable winds, with some rain.

Monday 11th.
Light variable winds, with showers.
Employed at getting water at Holoa, Hawaii.

Tuesday 12th.
Light variable winds with some thunders
and rain. At 7 P.M. got underway with a
light northerly wind, steering to the southward,
to get an offing. Latterpart steering about S.W.

Lat, 21° 37' N. Wednesday, 13th.
Light variable northerly winds, with some rain.
Steering to the westward, through the S.I. group,
to the southward of Onehow. Carrying all sail.

Lat, 21° 47'. Thursday, 14th.
Moderate northeast trade-winds. The ship
under all sail, steering W. Spoke ship Euphrates of B.
Three natives (men) of the S.I., were found to be on
board of the ship; they had secreted themselves at Holoa.

Friday, 15th.
Moderate, and middling strong N.E. trades,
with some rain. The ship under
all sail, including the foremast studding sail. Course W.
