

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of New Bedford.

Lat, $44^{\circ}28'$ N. Lon, $170^{\circ}59'$ E. ~~At~~ Tuesday, May 3rd, 1864.
Middling strong and moderate variable easterly and northeasterly winds. The ship under prudent sail on the starboard tack, steering N by W when she would.

Lat, $46^{\circ}19'$ Lon, $169^{\circ}50'$. Wednesday, 4th.
Moderate variable northerly winds. The ship under requisite sail, on the western tack. Course N by W.

Lat, $48^{\circ}23'$. Thursday, 5th.
Forepart moderate northerly winds; middle and latter part moderate northerly winds. The ship under requisite sail, on whichever tack she would lay nearest to N by W.

Lat, $48^{\circ}32'$ Lon, $171^{\circ}19'$. Friday, 6th.
Moderate and light variable northerly winds. The ship under all sail, by the wind on opposite tacks.

Lat, $49^{\circ}40'$ Lon, $168^{\circ}58'$. Saturday, 7th.
Moderate and middling strong strong variable northeasterly and northerly winds with some snow squalls. Saw a right whale. The ship under prudent sail, on the starboard tack.

Sunday, 8th.
Forepart, middling strong northerly winds; the ship on the starboard tack under prudent sail. Latter part, strong northerly winds. The ship laying hove to on the larboard tack.

Monday, 9th.
Forepart, blowing strong from the northward; the ship laying hove to, on the port tack, under a close reefed main topsail, main spencer, and fore topmast stagsail. Latter part, the wind more moderate; under prudent sail, on port tack.

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of New Bedford.

Lat, $50^{\circ}12'$ N. Lon, $171^{\circ}05'$ E. Tuesday, May 10th, 1864.
Forepart, middling strong northerly wind; the ship on the port tack. Middle, nearly calm. Latter part, light, moderate, and middling strong, variable easterly wind; steering N by W. Carrying requisite sail.

Lat, $51^{\circ}22'$. Wednesday, 11th.
Commences with middling strong northeasterly winds; steering N by W. Middle and latter part, fresh northerly winds, with some snow; the ship on opposite tacks. Under requisite sail.

Lat, $51^{\circ}31'$. Thursday, 12th.
Strong variable northwesterly winds, with some snow. The ship on the port tack, under short sail.

Lat, $52^{\circ}33'$ Lon, $171^{\circ}30'$. Friday, 13th.
Forepart, middling strong northwesterly winds; the ship on the port tack under short sail. Latter part moderate and light variable westerly winds; the ship under all sail, steering N by W. Saw three (the most western of the Fox Islands) bearing N by E, per compass distant 50 miles, or thereabouts.

Lat, $53^{\circ}28'$. Saturday, 14th.
Commences nearly calm. About 11 A.M. a light easterly wind sprang up, which gradually increased to a double reefed topsail breeze in the latter part. Courses N by N by W carrying requisite sail. Spowered three boats for a right whale.

Sunday, 15th.
Forepart, a middling strong variable northerly wind; latter part the wind more moderate. Saw two vessels. The ship under requisite sail throughout the day; on opposite tacks by the wind.
