

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of New Bedford.

Lat, $53^{\circ}36'$ N. Lon, $172^{\circ}16'$ E. Monday, May 16th 1864.
Moderate variable northwesterly winds. The ship under requisite sail on the port tack. Course N.

Tuesday, 17th.
Forepart, light variable westerly winds; the ship on the port tack. At 3 A.M. saw some light ice. Middle, light southerly winds; working to the northward through the ice. Latterpart, middling strong southeasterly winds; cruising in the ice. The ship under prudent sail throughout. Spoke barks Oriole and Congress, and ship Bartholomew Gosnold, of New Bedford.

Lat, $58^{\circ}02'$ Wednesday, 18th.
Middling strong southeasterly winds. The ship on opposite tacks under short sail. Thick, snowy, weather the most of the time. Saw a few cakes of ice.

Thursday, 19th.
Middling strong and moderate variable southeasterly winds, with snow. The ship under short sail, cruising around, and laying aback, in the ice. Saw a vessel.

Lat, $68^{\circ}46'$ Friday, 20th.
Moderate southeasterly winds. The ship under requisite sail cruising in, and around, light ice. Spoke bark Martha and ship Tabino of N Bedford.

Saturday, 21st.
Moderate northeasterly winds. Under requisite sail amongst light ice. Spoke whaler General Geste of Harve.

Sunday, 22nd.
Light winds; principally from the northward. The ship under requisite sail, around the ice. Some fog. Spoke ship Corinthian, and bark Washington, of N Bedford.

Lat, $59^{\circ}25'$ Lon $172^{\circ}38'$ E. Monday, May 23rd, 1864.
Light, variable, easterly, winds. The ship under requisite sail; in, and around the ice. Spoke ship Mount Wallsten, of New Bedford.

Lat, $60^{\circ}00'$ Tuesday, 24th.
Light, moderate, and middling strong, variable southeasterly winds. Saw twenty three vessels. The ship under requisite sail; cruising in, and around light ice.

Wednesday, 25th.
Forepart strong easterly winds. Middle, and latterpart, nearly calm. The ship under requisite sail on opposite tacks in the vicinity of the ice.

Lat, $59^{\circ}36'$ Thursday, 26th.
Forepart calm; middle a light variable westerly wind. Latterpart, light southwesterly winds with fog. The ship under necessary sail; working to the northward part of the time, and laying aback in the fog. Saw some light ice.

Friday, 27th.
Forepart, calm; middle, and latterpart, light and moderate variable northeasterly winds. The ship under necessary sail; in and around ice. Some fog.

Saturday, 28th.
Strong northerly winds, with snow. The ship under short sail, in, and around the ice. Saw several vessels.

Sunday, 29th.
Moderate and light northwesterly winds. In the company of ships Europa, barks Tamerlane and Camilla of N Bedford; and Beazant of Honolulu. Under requisite sail. Saw land on the Heamtschakka shore.
