

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickason, of New Bedford.

Lat, $51^{\circ}30'N$. Monday, May 30th, 1864.
Light variable airs. The ship under necessary sail; cruising around in, light, scattering, ice.

Tuesday, 31st.
Forepart light northerly winds; steering a southwesterly course along the ice. Afterpart moderate northeasterly winds, with some snow; laying around in the vicinity of the ice. Spoke the German ship Julian, the Govt. Group (ship), ship Eliza Adams, ship Enphrates, and bark Ellen Snow, of N Bedford carrying requisite sail throughout the day.

Wednesday, June 1st.
Moderate and strong northerly winds; with some fog. The ship under short sail; cruising in, and around the ice.

Thursday, 2nd.
Moderate and middling strong northerly winds; with some rain, and fog. The ship under short sail cruising near the ice. Spoke bark Abigail, of N Bedford.

Lat, $51^{\circ}30'$. Friday, 3rd.
Moderate and middling strong northerly winds. The ship under requisite sail around the ice.

Lat, $51^{\circ}36'$. Saturday, 4th.
Middling strong, moderate, and light variable northerly winds. Under necessary sail; in, and around the ice.

Lat, $51^{\circ}42'$. Sunday, 5th.
Light variable northerly winds. The ship under necessary sail, cruising in, and around the ice. Spoke bark Isabella, of New Bedford.

Monday, 6th.
Light variable winds. The ship under requisite sail; cruising in and around ice. Spoke ship Emily Wagon of N.B.

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Lat, $51^{\circ}56'N$. Tuesday, June 7th, 1864.
Light and moderate variable winds, principally from the northward. Under prudent sail. Cruising in the ice.

Wednesday, 8th.
Light variable winds. The ship under requisite sail, making through light ice to the northward. Spoke ship Abigail, of New Bedford.

Thursday, 9th.
Light and moderate variable winds, principally from the northward, with some fog. The ship under necessary sail; working N & E through the ice.

Lat $61^{\circ}38'$. Longitude, $178^{\circ}06'E$. Friday, 10th.
Light variable westerly winds. The ship under requisite sail; working to the northward; through clear water, and ice.

Lat $61^{\circ}28'$. Saturday, 11th.
Light southerly winds. The ship following the edge of the ice, in a northeasterly direction till 8 P.M., then ~~lost~~ ^{laid} ~~laid~~ ^{laid} aback in the fog on the starboard tack. Spoke ship Milo of N Bedford carrying necessary sail.

Sunday, 12th.
Light southerly winds with fog. The ship under easy sail laying aback the greater part of the time.

Monday, 13th.
Light moderate and middling strong southwesterly winds with fog. Under easy sail on opposite tacks; laying aback part of the time.

Tuesday, 14th.
Middling strong southwesterly winds; with fog. The ship under short sail, on opposite tacks. Saw some ice.

Wednesday, 15th.
Moderate and light variable southeasterly winds, with fog. The ship on opposite tacks; under easy sail.
