

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of N Bedford.

Thursday, September 1st, 1864.
Lat, 70° 04' N. Forepart, light, and moderate, easterly winds; with some rain.
The ship under requisite sail; cruising in and around ice. Spoke ship Hilman, of N Bedford.

Friday, 2nd.
Lat, 70° 02'. Moderate and light winds; forepart, easterly; latterpart, westerly. Under requisite sail; cruising near ice. Spoke bark Covington, of Warren, N.S.

Saturday, 3rd.
Forepart, moderate variable winds; on opposite tacks. Middle, strong northerly winds; steering south. Latterpart, strong northerly winds; on opposite tacks. Under prudent sail. Spoke bark Coral, of N.B.

Sunday, 4th.
Strong northerly winds; with snow. Saw some ice. The ship under prudent sail; on opposite tacks.

Monday, 5th.
Lat, 69° 12'. Lon, 174° 03'. Middling strong, moderate, and, light, northerly winds; with some snow, and fog. Under requisite sail; on opposite tacks.

Tuesday, 6th.
Lat, 68° 45'. Moderate northerly winds; with some rain, and, fog. The ship under requisite sail; on opposite tacks.

Wednesday, 7th.
Forepart, light northerly winds; latterpart, light easterly winds, with fog. Cruising around under requisite sail. Saw ice to the northeastward. Bent a new main spencer.

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of N Bedford.

Thursday, 8th Sept, 1864.
Lat, 68° 28' N. Forepart, light; middle, moderate; latterpart, strong variable northeasterly winds. Carrying sail according to the wind, on opposite tacks. Spoked for 20 miles, and the heaved boat struck, and the iron drew.

Friday, 9th.
Middling strong, and moderate, northerly winds; with rain and fog. Under requisite sail, on opposite tacks.

Saturday, 10th.
Lat, 68° 54'. Lon, 172° 12' W. Moderate and middling strong, southerly winds, with some rain, fog, and snow. The ship under requisite sail, by the wind, on opposite tacks, except from three to seven P.M., whilst steering N.W.

Sunday, 11th.
Lat, 68° 40'. Forepart, light southerly winds; the ship on the eastern tack. Middle, and latterpart, moderate and, middling strong, northerly winds; with some fog; the ship on opposite tacks. Carrying sail according to the wind throughout the day. Spoked for a while, about six P.M.

Monday, 12th.
Lat, 68° 25'. Lon, 171° 06' W. Blowing strong from the northward. The ship under short sail; on the eastern tack.

Tuesday, 13th.
Lat, 68° 22'. Lon, 170° 41'. Strong, and, middling strong, northeasterly winds. The ship under prudent sail, on the eastern tack.

Wednesday, 14th.
Lat, 68° 39'. Lon, 168° 22'. Moderate northeasterly winds. The ship under requisite sail on the eastern tack in the fore and middle part. Latterpart steering ^{south} east by south per compass. Saw some ice in the distance to the westward.
