

Remarks on board ship Thomas Dickson, of New Bedford.

Friday, April 14th 1865.
Light, variable, airs; with some fog. The ship, laying at an anchor at Talcahuano.
Employed at washing the ship, &c.

Saturday, 15th.
Moderate, and middling strong, northerly winds.

Sunday, 16th.
Light winds; principally from the Southward.

Monday, 17th.
Moderate southerly winds.

Tuesday, 18th.
Light and moderate variable southerly winds.

Wednesday, 19th.
Light, and moderate, variable winds.

Thursday, 20th.
Light, moderate and strong northerly winds; with westerly variations. At 8 A.M. let go the 2nd anchor, and took it again at 4 P.M.

Friday, 21st.
Moderate, and, light, variable, winds.

Saturday, 22nd.
Moderate and light variable southerly winds.

Sunday, 23rd.
Light, variable, southerly, winds.

Monday, 24th.
Light variable winds. Took on board some fresh water; and about 60 bbls of oil on freight.

Tuesday, April 25th 1865.
Light, variable, southerly, winds.
The ship laying at an anchor, at Talcahuano.

Wednesday, 26th.
Light, and moderate, southerly, winds.

Thursday, 27th.
Light, and moderate, southerly, winds.
At 4 P.M. took the anchor, made full sail, and went to sea. Latter part, on the western tack.

At 3 1/2 M. S. Lon, 13 22 W. Friday, 28th.
Middling strong and moderate southerly winds. Under necessary sail; on the port tack. Whilst laying in Talcahuano, the following were deserted from the ship, Manuel Orter, Beckino, Manuel Quintos, Barker Davis, Frank Tanashee, Mac Donald, Wm Paul, C Smith, & Wm Gray. Employed at stowing the anchors & chains, &c.

At 3 1/2 M. Saturday, 29th.
Middling strong and moderate variable southerly winds. Under requisite sail; on the port tack.

At 3 1/2 S. Lon, 8 24. Sunday, 30th.
Moderate, and light, variable, southerly, winds.
The ship under requisite sail; on the port tack.
