the NW to sent up the four topmasts yards
and bent the topmasts set it set the four
topmasts hussel

this 24 hours commences with very fresh breeze
from the NW all sail set Steaming SE latter
part thick and rainy weather saw a ship or
whale feed no whale the latter part Steaming East

saturday february
the 6

Remark on board saturday february the 6
this 24 hours very good weather all sail set
Steaming SE East winds from the westward
at one PM saw two Right Whales longi in three
with three lots struck one killed him took the
whale to the ship but him in set the try masts
& going at knight double kept the topails Steaming
East wind NW lat 45:58 longi 1:38:34

in boiling the whale saw humpbacks no right
whale at knight double kept the topails SE

Steaming East at daylight got through boiling the
whale at 10 AM broke out the main hatch and stood down
the oil had to have to untill we got through standing
down the oil 90 barrels or it stood down but 60 or it
latter part the weather proving good made more sail
nothing in life left Longi

the first part of these 24 hours very strong wind
from the westward Steaming East the latter part
or this day very light breeze and clear weather all
sail set at knight double stood down the topmasts
it being very bad sea on and no wind at all
lat 45:40 longi 1:47:59 So ends the day

to advantage nothing in life but birds &
the latter making a cubboard for the Steaming

East & SE all sail set to advantage cleared the
bone & hussel it put it below latter part calm

set Steaming SE winds from the westward
nothing in life but birds no whale the
latter part foggy weather
lat 47:07 longi 1:56:41 So ends the day
