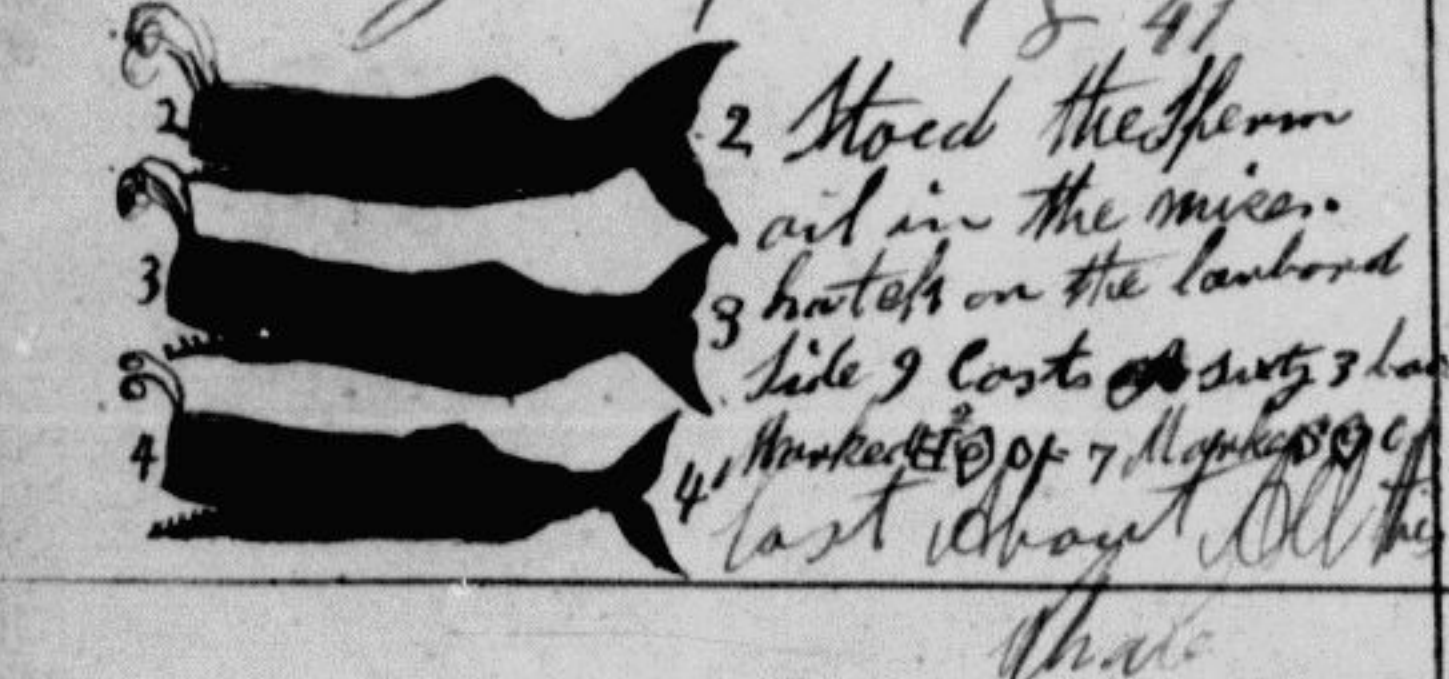


A Journal or A Whaling voyage from Stonington

Wednesday April the 14 1841	Remark on board Wednesday April the 14 this day commences with strong winds from the Southward At 11 PM it blew a gail took in the fairsail and lost the main topsail strong gails throughout the day the Cooper setting up Shuckers latt part bedding up etc &c &c Saw Whales one mile off latt. longi. to end the day
Thursday April the 15 1841	Remark on Board Thursday April the 15 this day commences with a gail from the Southward At 12 PM it began to moderate but the fairsail let two flaps out on the main topsail latter part very light breeze saw one gail At 5 PM he got clear a drift to land of hot on board the ship. America or Starbedford 10 M length 2000 barrels or oil off knight No kind closed the bone the had on the forecalf latt 45:25 longi 1:15:30
Friday April the 16 1841	Remark on board Friday April the 16 this day commences with strong winds from the SW at daylight made sail heeded to the SW a very bad sea on the saw a sail to the SW the people fished in bunching the bone got through stood it forward between decks at knight very light breeze took in sail latt 45:25 longi 1:15:36 So ends
Saturday April the 17 1841	Remark on board Saturday April the 17 this day very strong winds from the NE heading to the Westward At daylight made sun sail steaming West until 2 PM shortened sail a gail very bad sea on wind held to SW saw one whight whale but two flaps to bar the boats the Cooper setting up Pipes at knight more moderate latt 45:01 longi 1:14:33
Sunday April the 18 1841	Remark on board Sunday April the 18 All this day very good weather At daylight made sail standing to the Southward At 8 AM saw sperm whales two miles off to the leeward left of four them At 9 AM three boats in chase struck three killed them At one PM got them to the ship put the flukes up on them and commenced cutting got two in at knight took in sail saw whight whale charged struck one the iron broad came on board saw two sails set one whale stand until morning latt 45:01 longi 1:14:33
Monday April 19 1841	Remark on board Monday April the 19 this day very strong gail from the South with the whale along side At 8 AM saw ship part of Southern fluke roof on the whale heeded to the SE Drifted ship under a lost kept main topsail histed up the lee boats latter part bad sea on sun Main latt 44:32 longi 1:14

Tuesday April 20	Remark on Board Tuesday April the 20 this very strong gail from the SW until 3 PM the hustled and hee cut what wee could and let him go got but little or him latter part more moderate Set the fairsail and set the try works of going saw whight whales around the ship very bad sea on latt 44:59 longi 1:15:40
Wednesday April the 21	Remark on board Wednesday April the 21 All this day a gail from the SW heading to the West and SW Gail took in the fairsail ship under a lost kept main topsail and could down the try works at knight the wind held around to SW very bad sea on sun Main latt 45:34 longi 1:15:51 So ends the day
Thursday April the 22 1841	Remark on board Thursday April the 22 All this day very strong gails from the SW ship under a lost kept main topsail and sun part of the day had the fairsail on the ship and held set hail the blubber sun very strong hail squalls heading NW drift about South latt 45:30 longi 1:16:00 Saw a sail to the Westward
Friday April the 23	Remark on board Friday April the 23 this day commences with a gail from the SW ship under a lost kept main topsail heading to the SW until one PM saw ship heeded up South set the fairsail the weather more moderate set the try works of going saw a sail to the leeward latt 44:18 longi 1:16:16 So ends these 24 hours
Saturday April the 24	Remark on board Saturday April the 24 this day commences with fresh breeze from the SW heading to the Southward latter part the wind held around to SW saw ship steaming SW by S At daylight made sail broke out the stern hatch on the leeward side stood down the oil 45 or whale 30 or sperm saw two ship steaming to the SW at knight took in sail so Phales in life latt 44:00 longi 1:16:00
Sunday April the 25	Remark on board Sunday April the 25 All this day very fine weather At daylight made sail saw two ships latter part very light breeze from the South saw the land the banks or venniber 40 miles distant sailing West the ship Averghaican or Bremen 12 M length 2600 barrels or oil went sun rather or him and sun rather stars latt 44:20 longi 1:15:56 At knight took in sail
